

## Health Care Facilities

The information presented on health care facilities comes from the Division of Health Facilities in the Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals (DIA). This state agency is responsible for inspection of all Chapter 135C licensed health care facilities in Iowa, including those presented in the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book. Under state law the DIA is responsible for the inspection and licensure of Hospitals (135B), Birth Centers (135G), Hospices (135J) and Psychiatric Medical Institutes for Children (135H). This agency also conducts inspections of various Medicare/Medicaid entities (e.g., skilled nursing facilities, home health agencies, hospices, hospitals, CLIA labs, etc.) through contract with the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA), and investigates complaints of substandard care or services in these entities. There is only one Intermediate Care Facility for Persons with Mental Illness in Iowa (a 25-bed unit in Davis County), so unlike previous editions of the Iowa Health Fact Book, statewide data for this type of facility is not presented.

## **Community and Migrant Health Centers**

Community and migrant health centers provide affordable, accessible, and acceptable primary health care to Iowans. These centers primarily serve indigent, medically-underserved and under-insured populations and assist special populations through grants and programs.

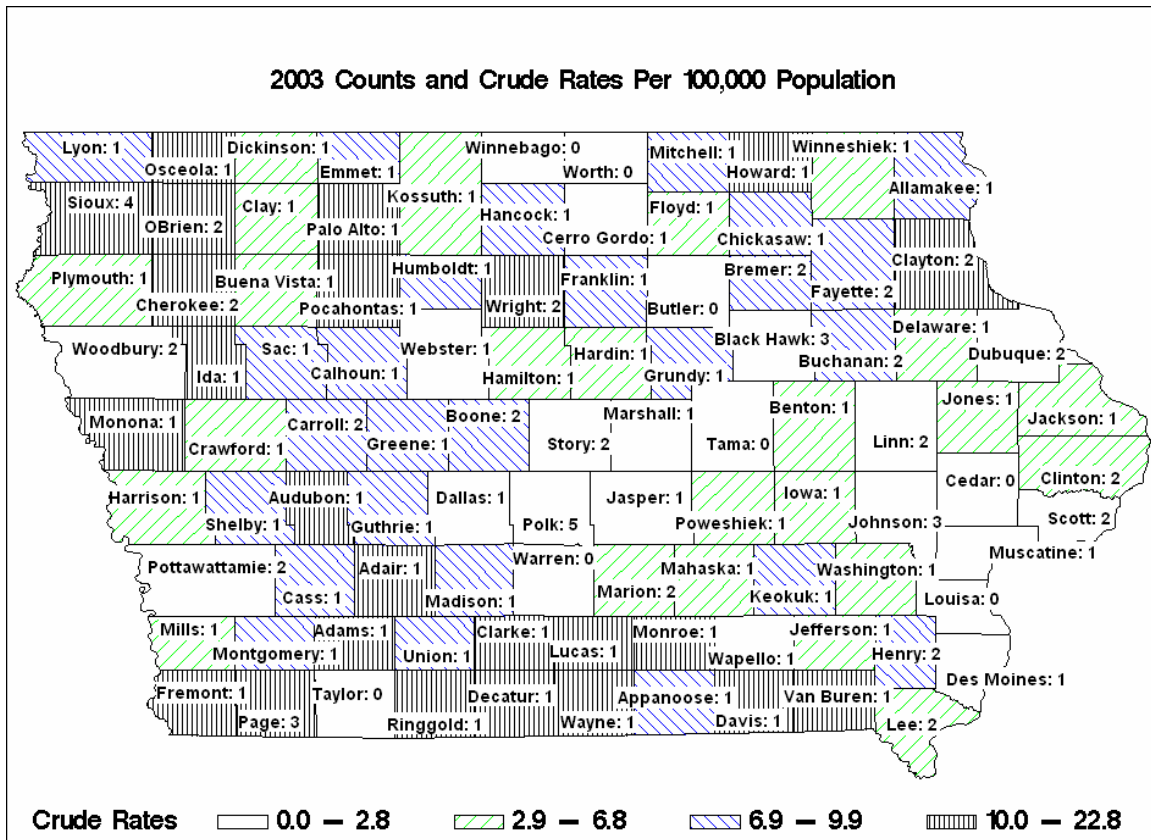
Community and migrant health centers are the safety net providers. They provide several health services to the community, including comprehensive health services with a variety of physician specialties, general dentistry and community health programs involving oral health education and dental screening, prenatal care, family planning, health screenings, immunizations, case management and pharmacies. Centers may be affiliated with a regional health system that can provide access to substantial support systems.

Community Health Centers are funded by Section 330 funds of the Public Health Service Act and Iowa has eight such centers (plus the Des Moines Health Center, which provides similar services). They are required to provide primary health services, dental services, mental health services, prevention, education, and case management. Patients cannot be turned away on the basis of ability to pay. A sliding fee scale based on income is mandated. The C/MHC model is a non-profit corporation whose board members must be members of the community and at least one percent of the board must be patients of the health center. 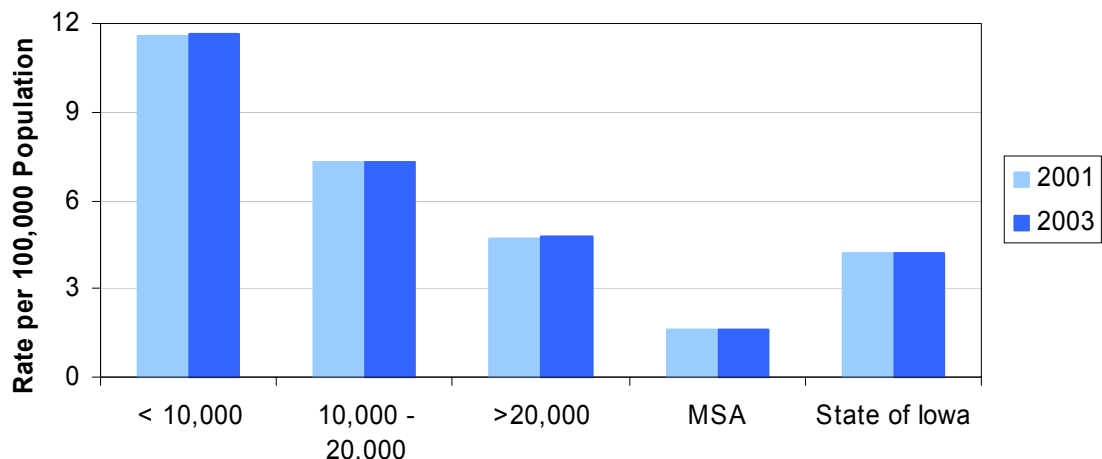
## **Certified Rural Health Clinics and Community Health Centers**

A rural health clinic is a clinic located in a rural area designated as a shortage area for personal health service and/or primary medical care manpower. In July of 2003, there were a total of 129 certified rural health clinics in Iowa (Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals), located in 53 of our 99 counties. Such a clinic is neither a rehabilitation agency nor a facility primarily for the care and treatment of mental diseases. Patient services are furnished by a physician's assistant or nurse practitioner at least 50 percent of the time the clinic operates. The definition of such is found in Title 42 in the Code of Federal Regulations. Rural Health Clinics receive enhanced reimbursement for Medicare.

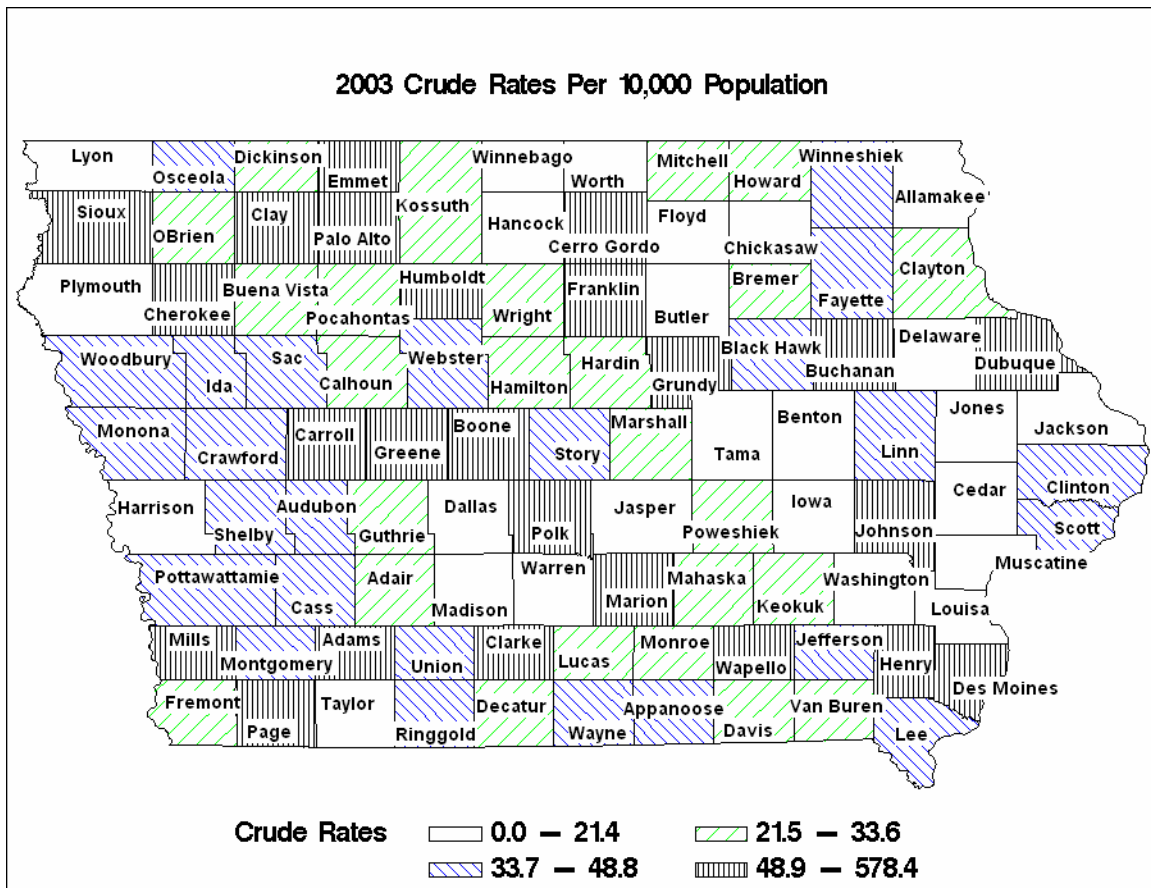

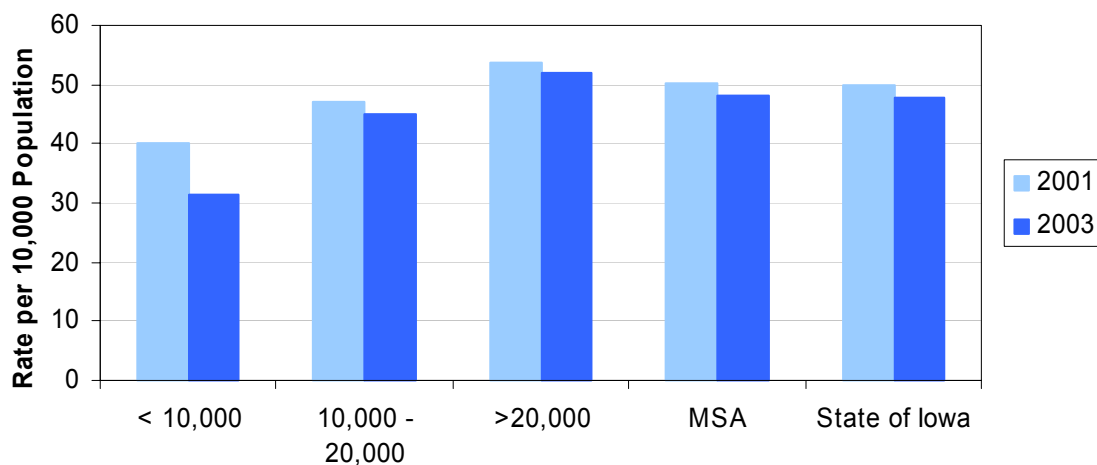

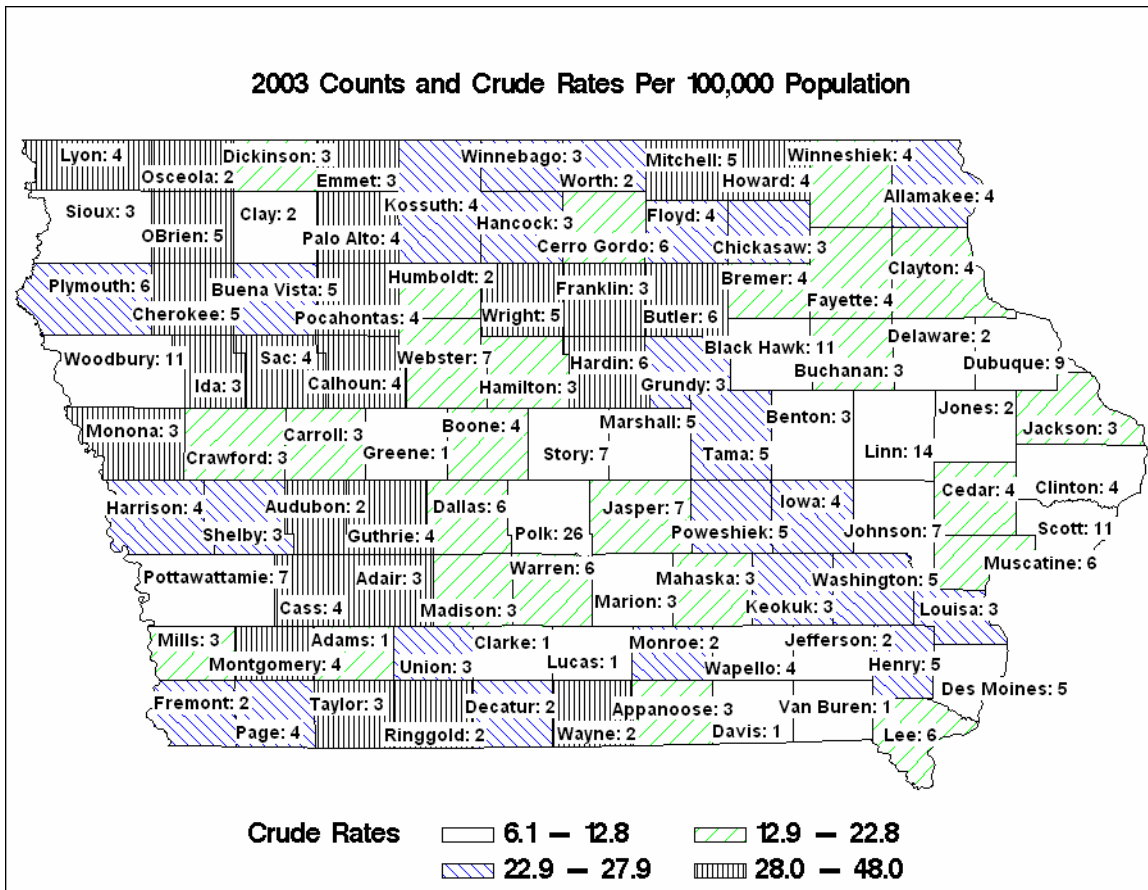


## Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003

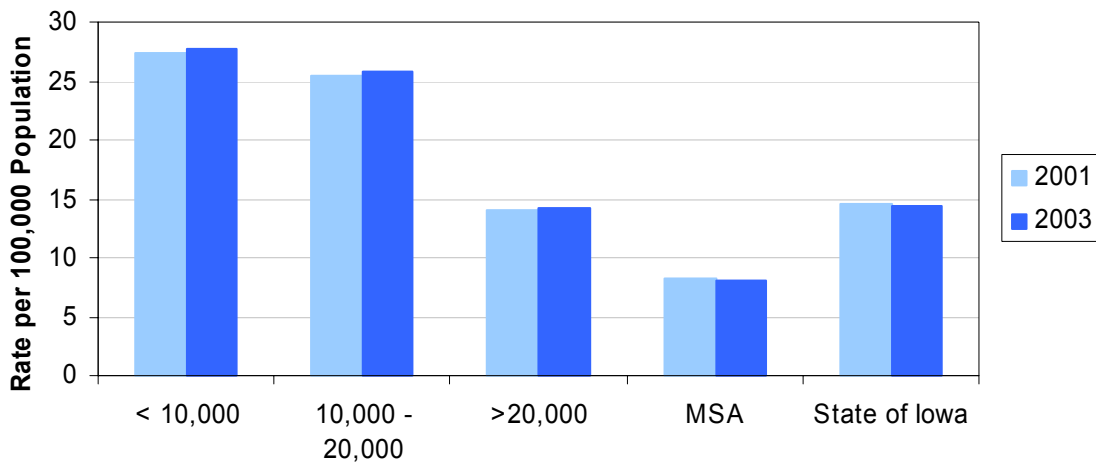


Distribution of Counties by Average Population (1992-2000)

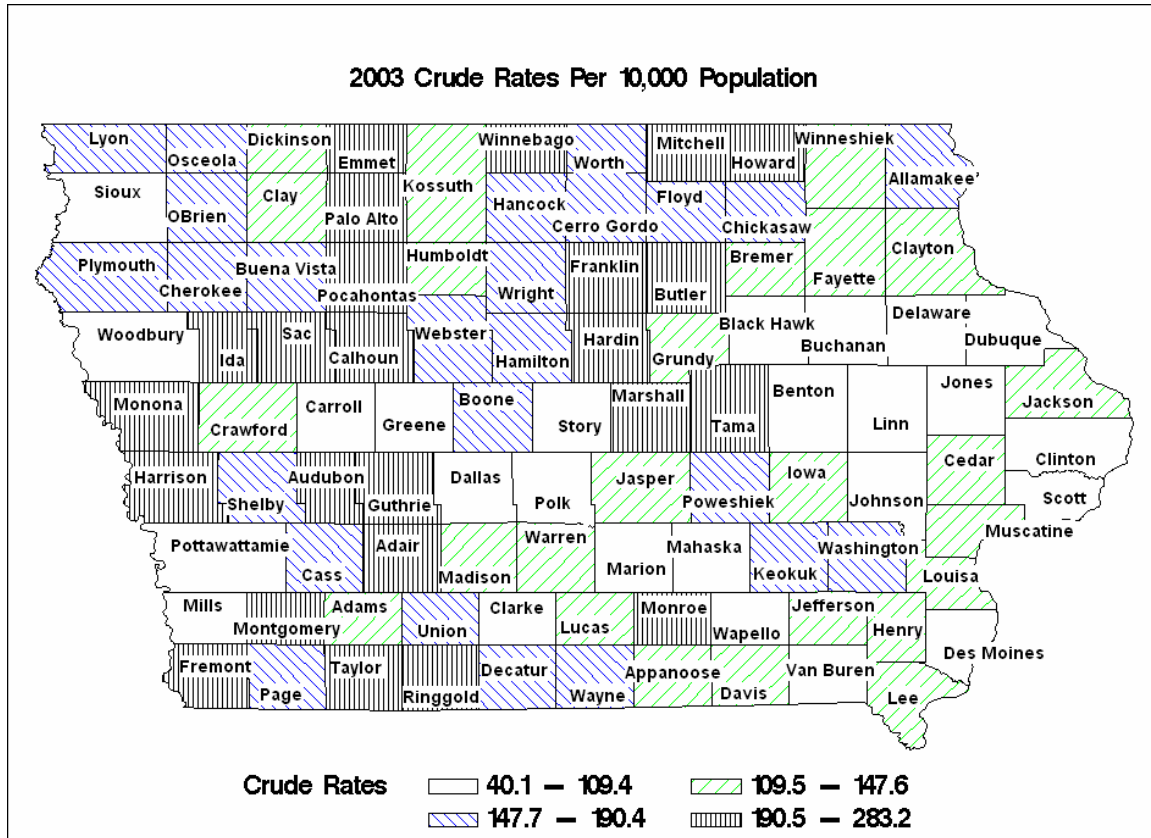

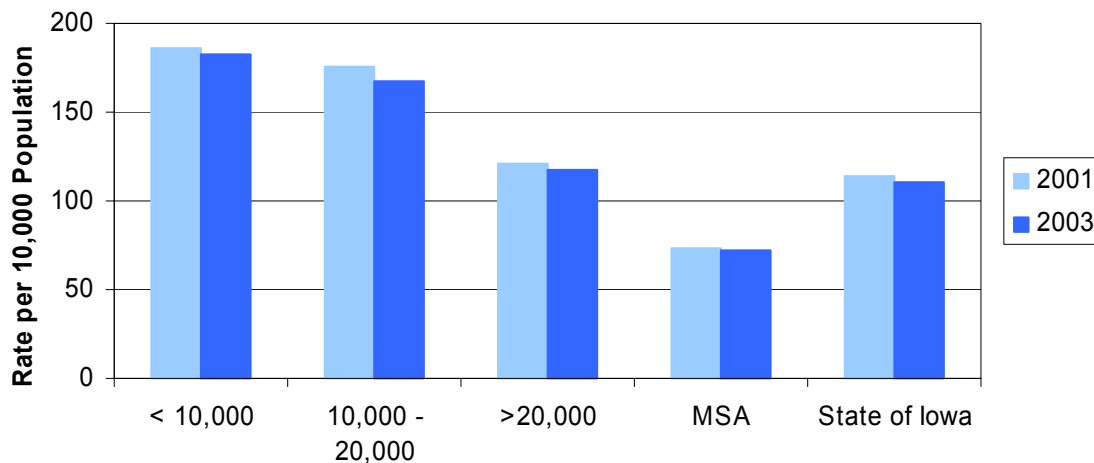

## Nursing Facility Beds

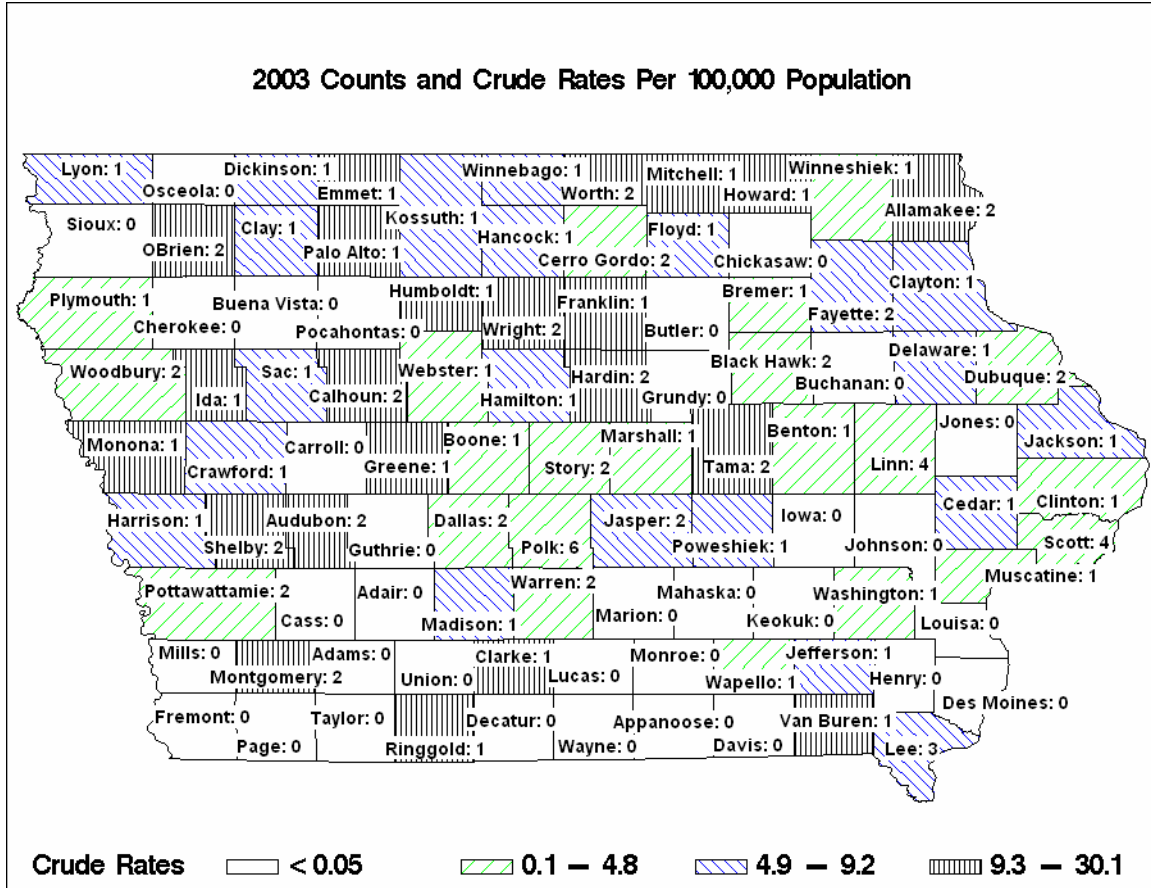


### Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003

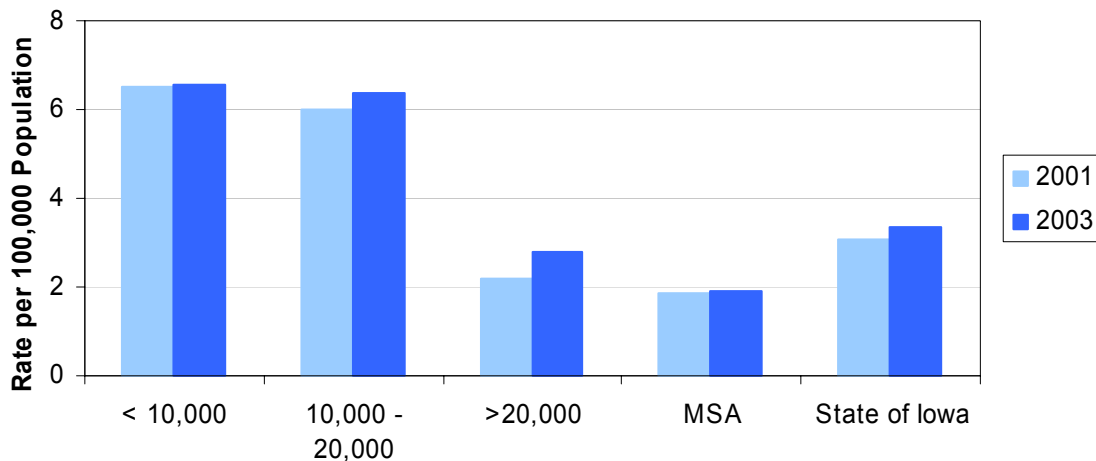


Distribution of Counties by Average Population (1992-2000)

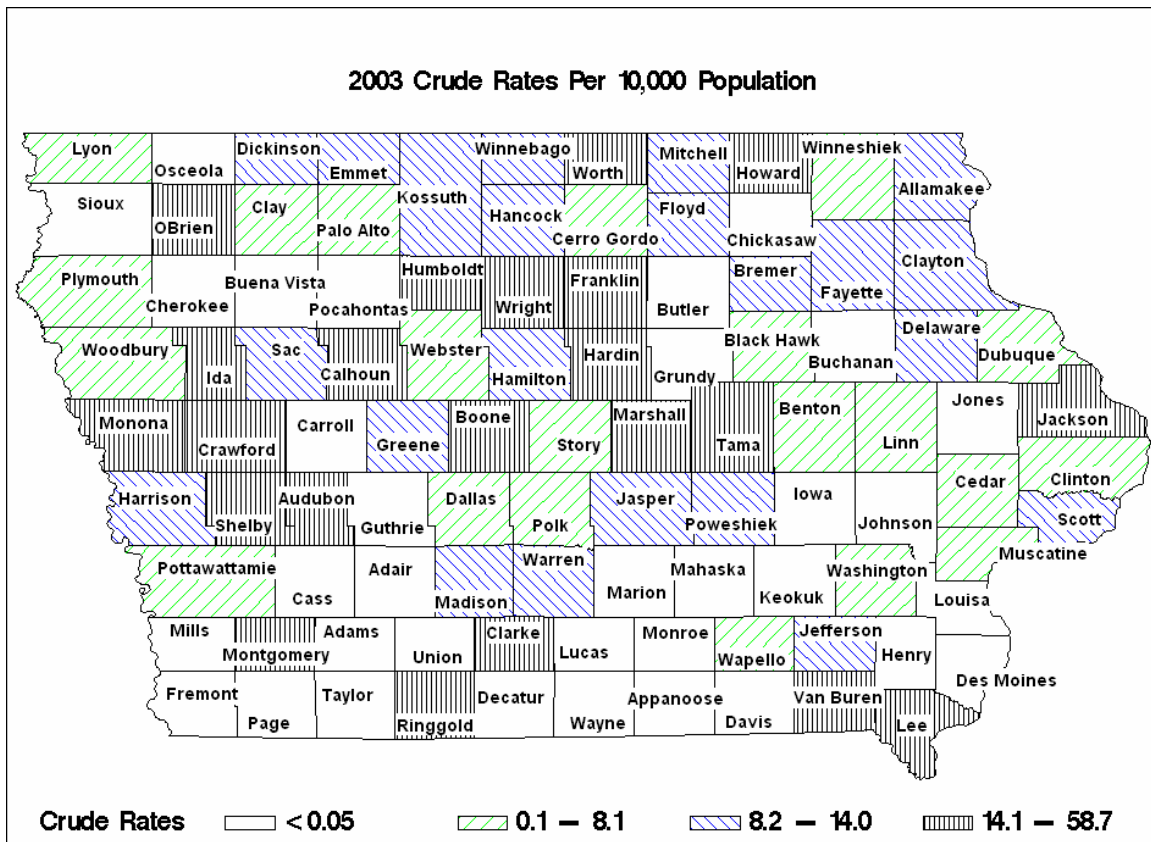

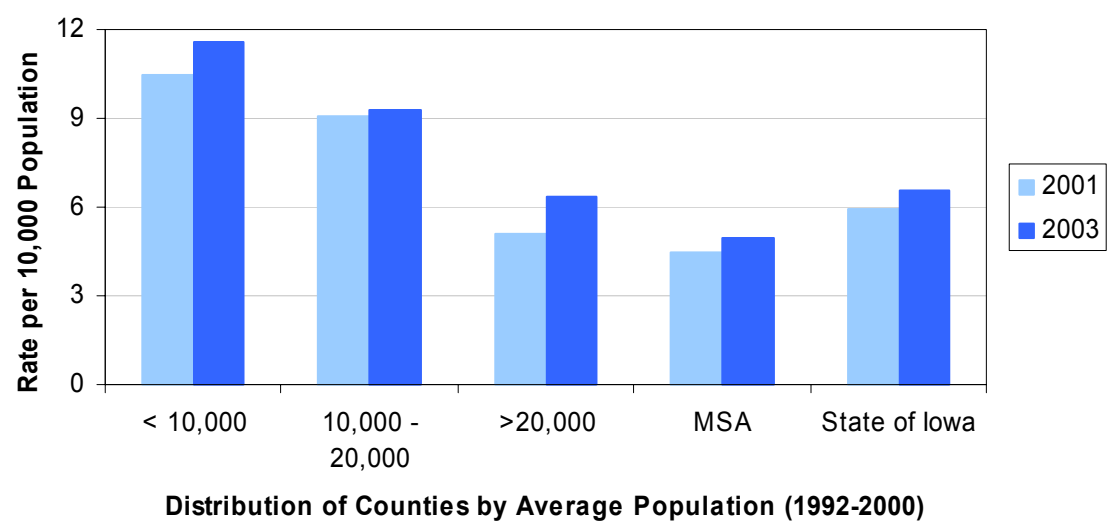

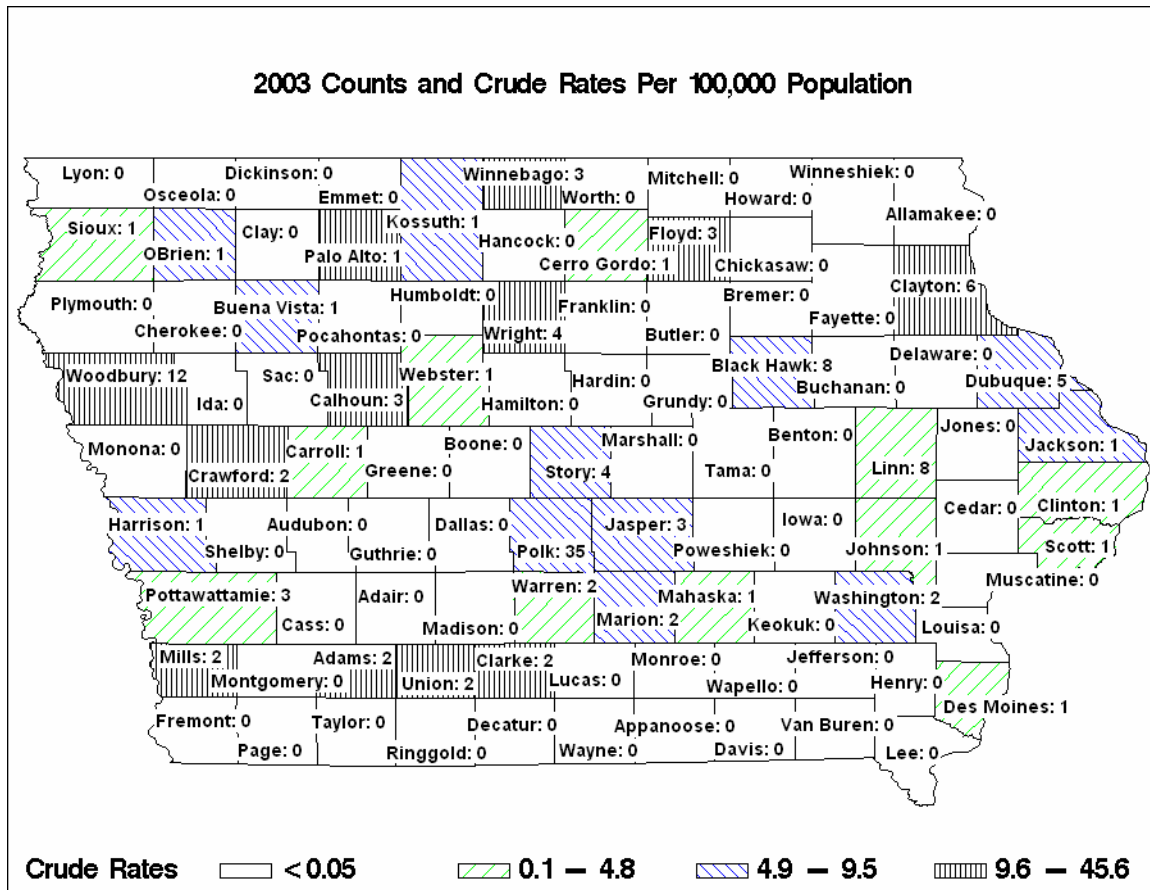
## Beds in Chronic Confusion or Dementing Illness Units



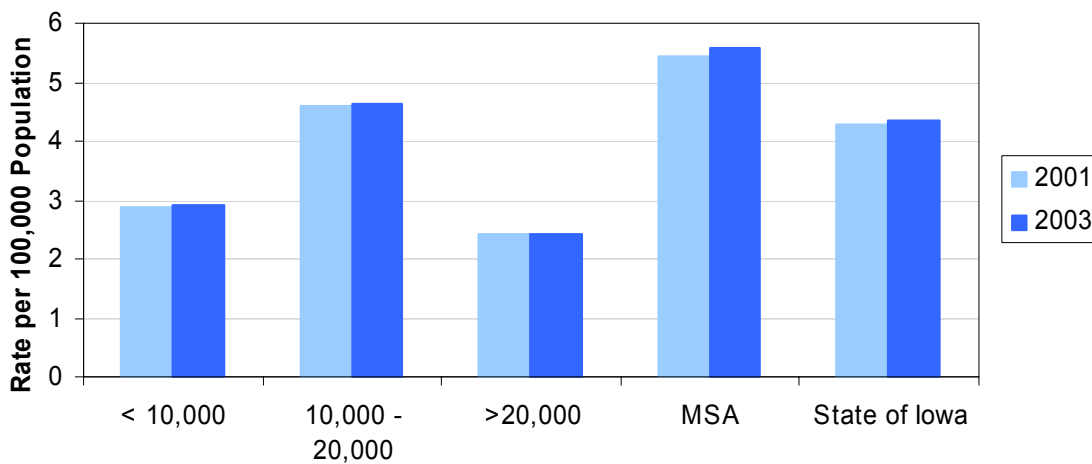

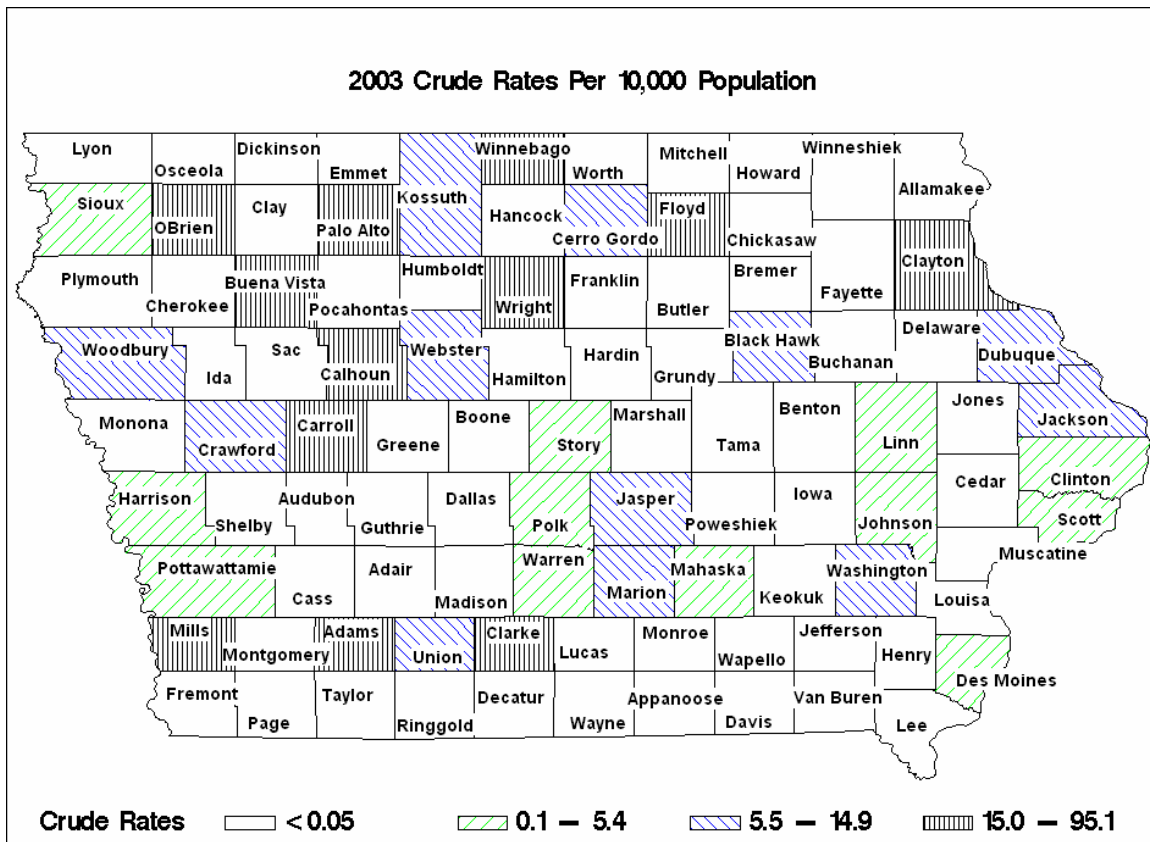

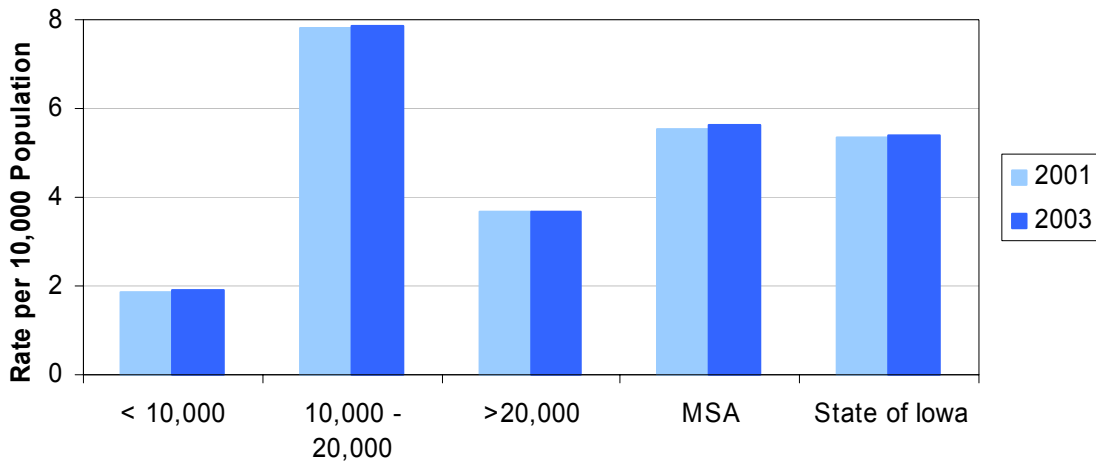

## Intermediate Care Beds for the Mentally Retarded

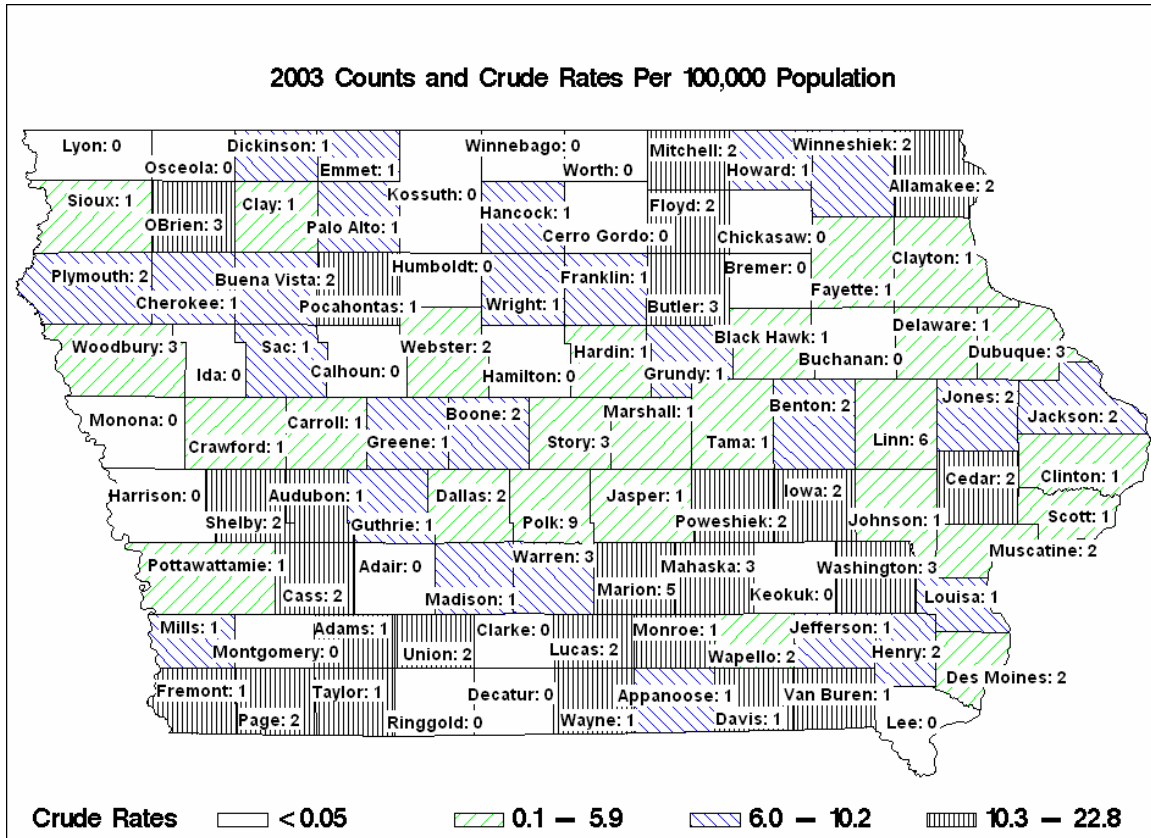

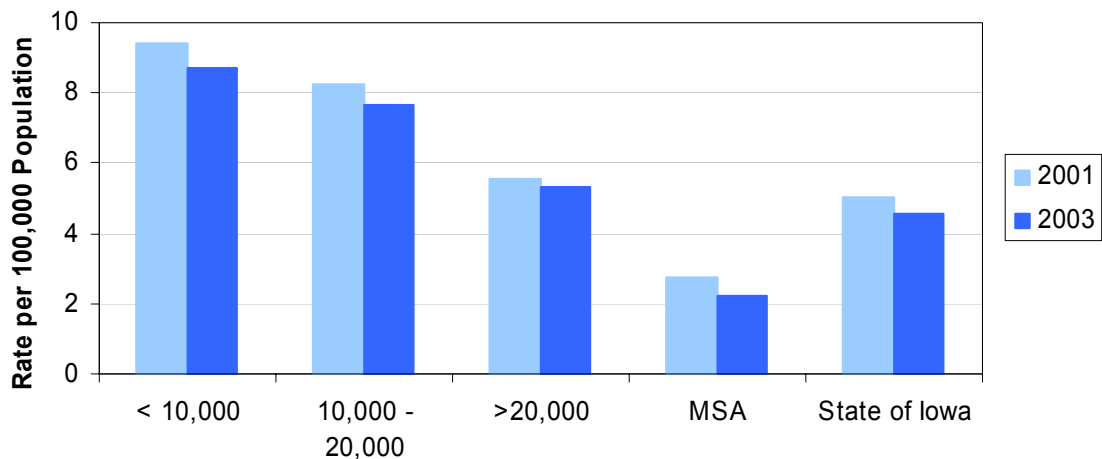


**Distribution of Counties by Average Population (1992-2000)**

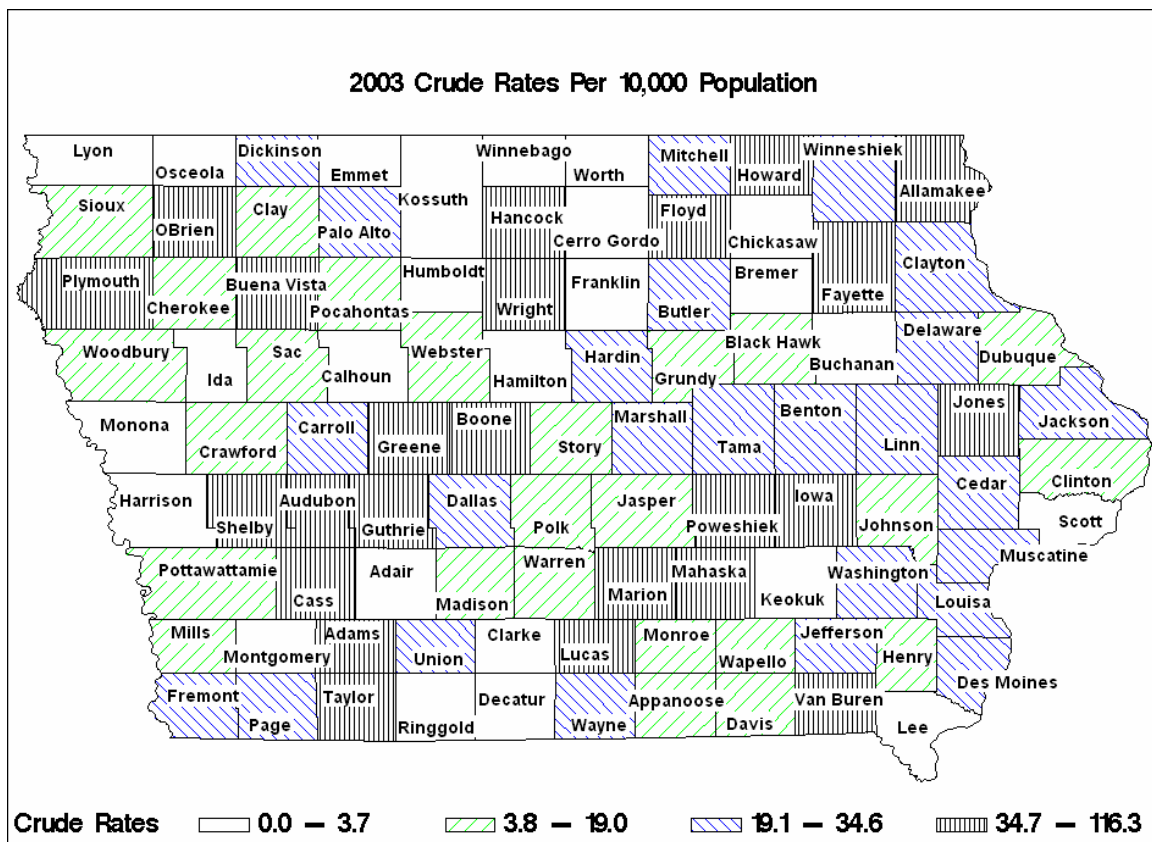

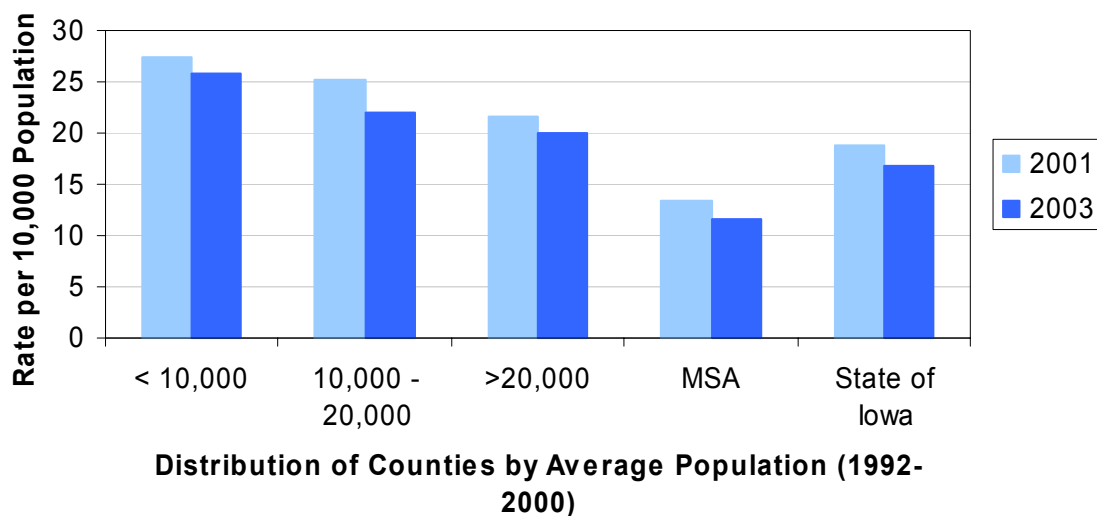

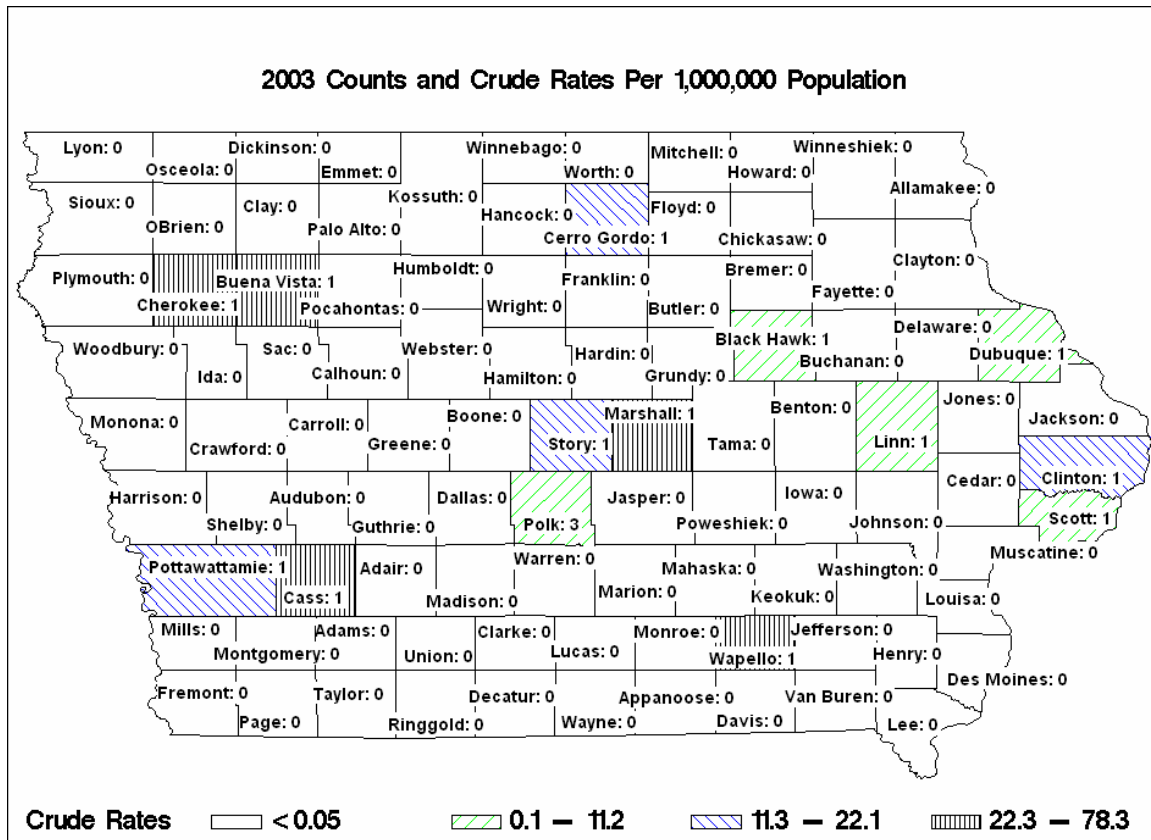
## Beds in Residential Care Facilities



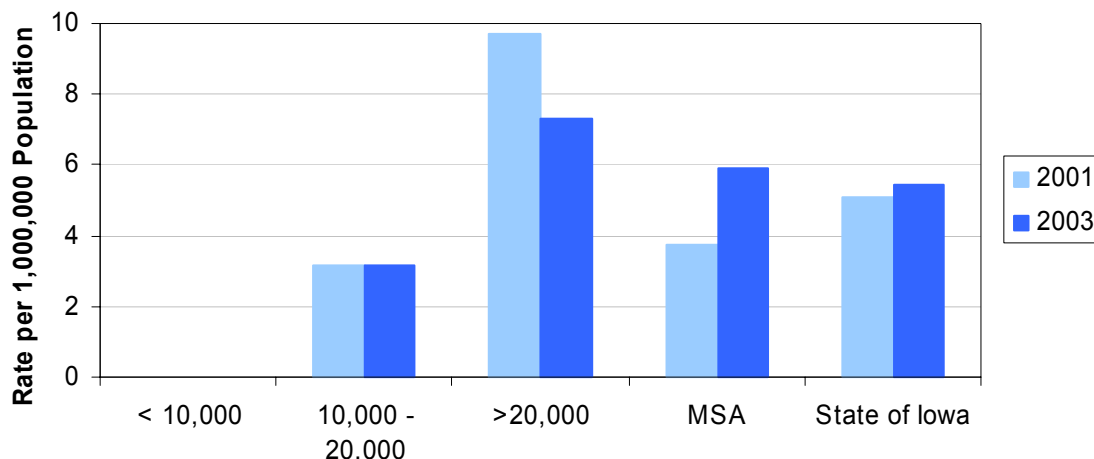

## Residential Care Facilities for Persons with Mental Illness



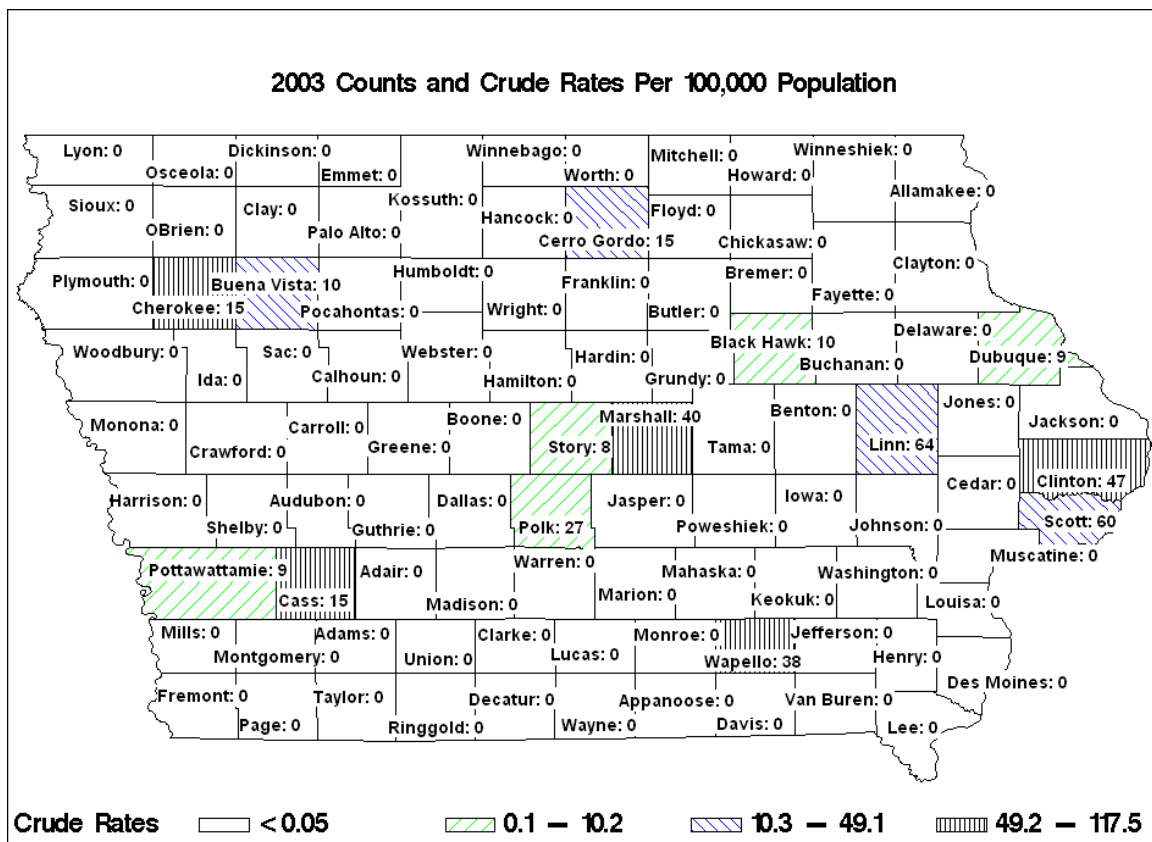

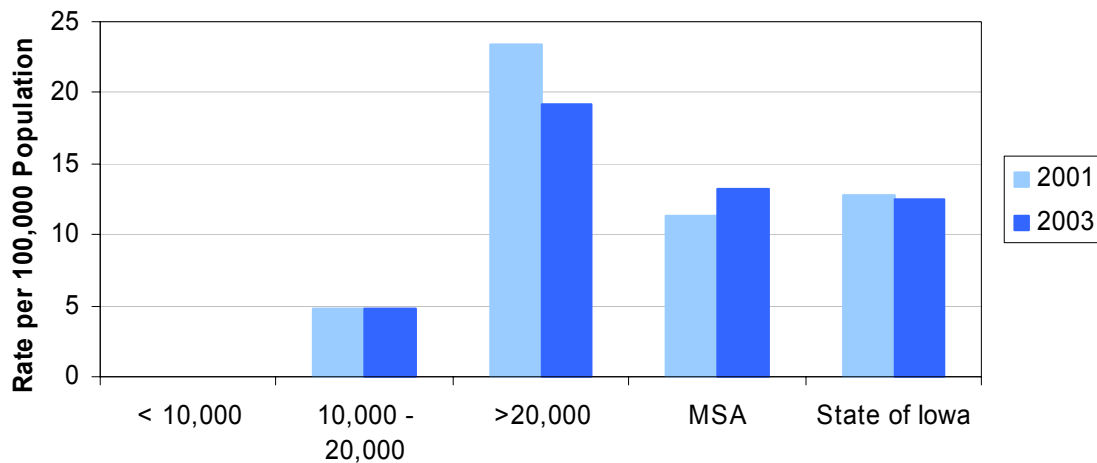
**Distribution of Counties by Average Population (1992-2000)**

# Beds in Residential Care Facilities for Persons with Mental Illness



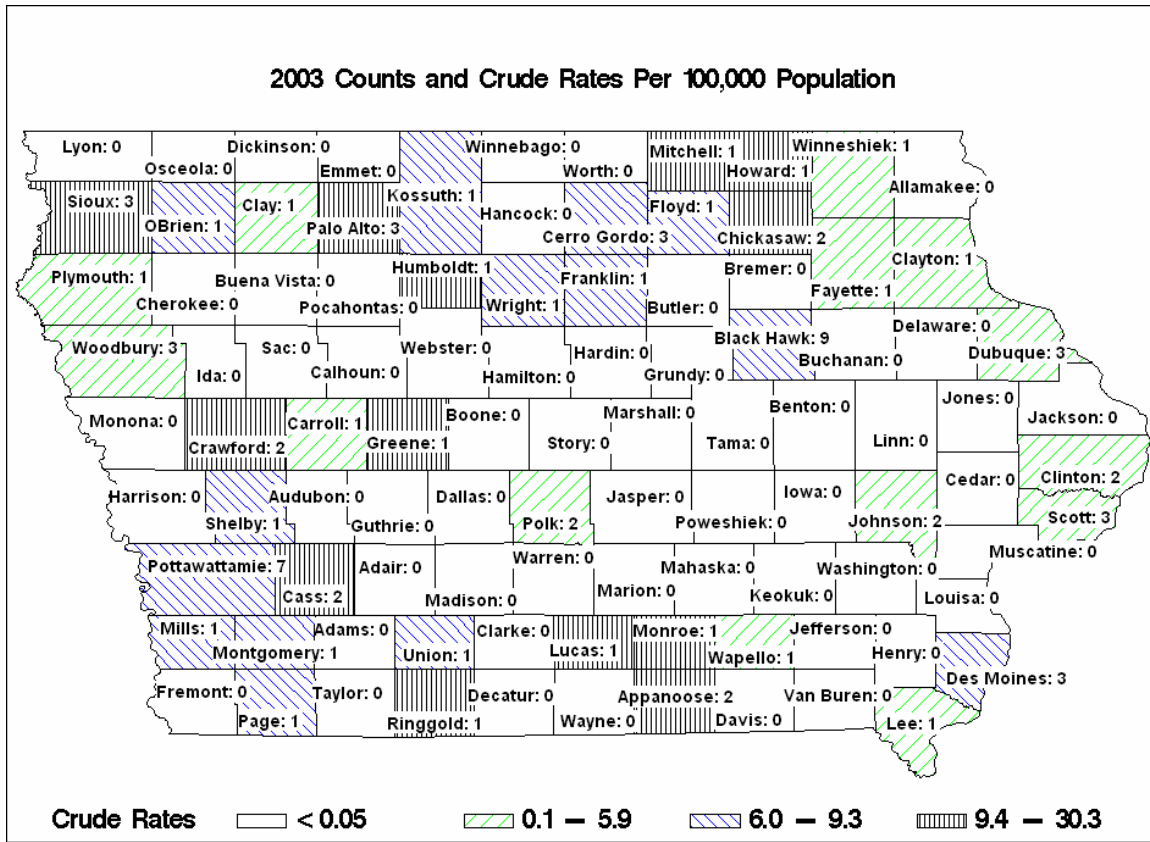

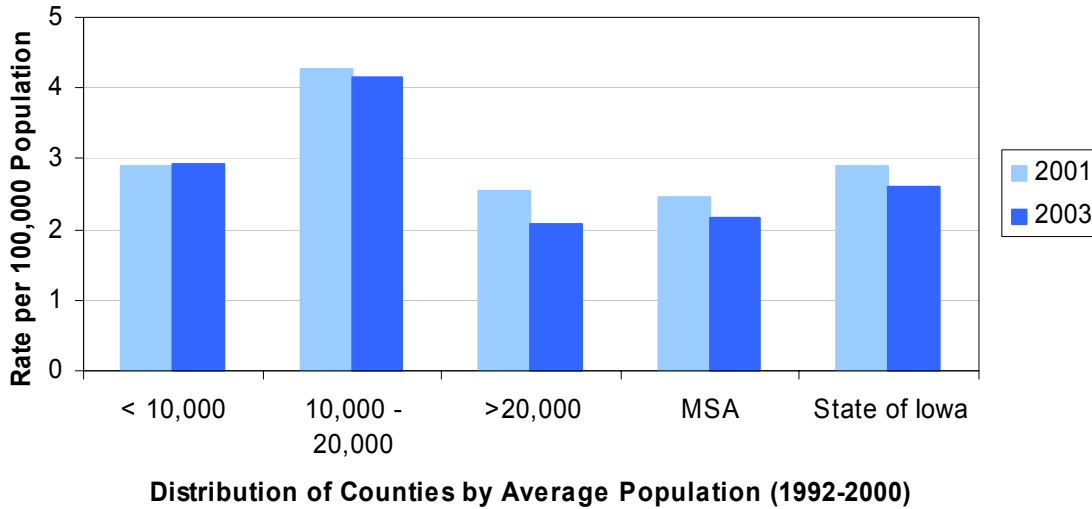

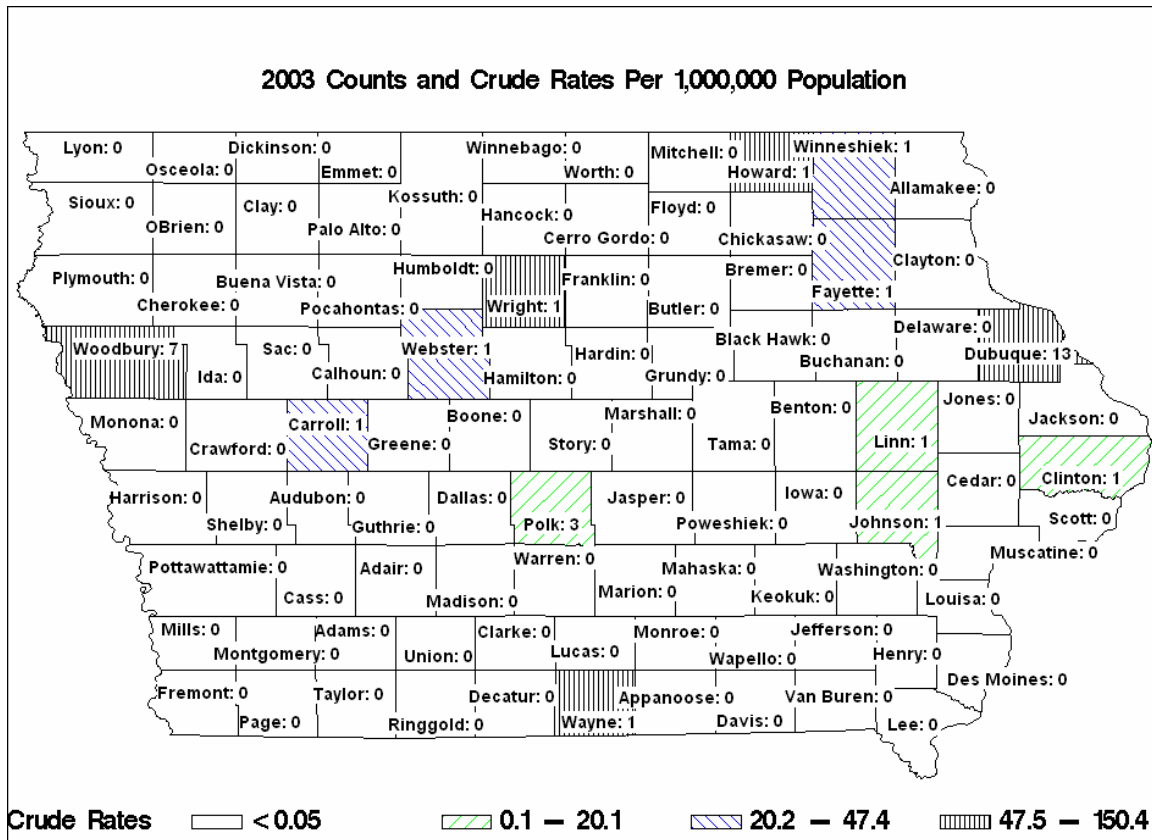

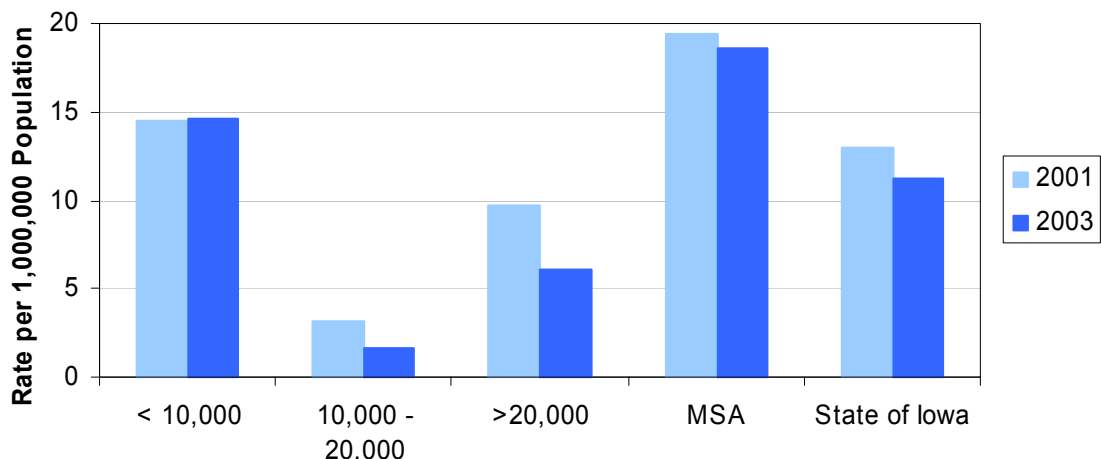


**Distribution of Counties by Average Population (1992-2000)**

### 3-5 Bed Units for the Mentally Retarded



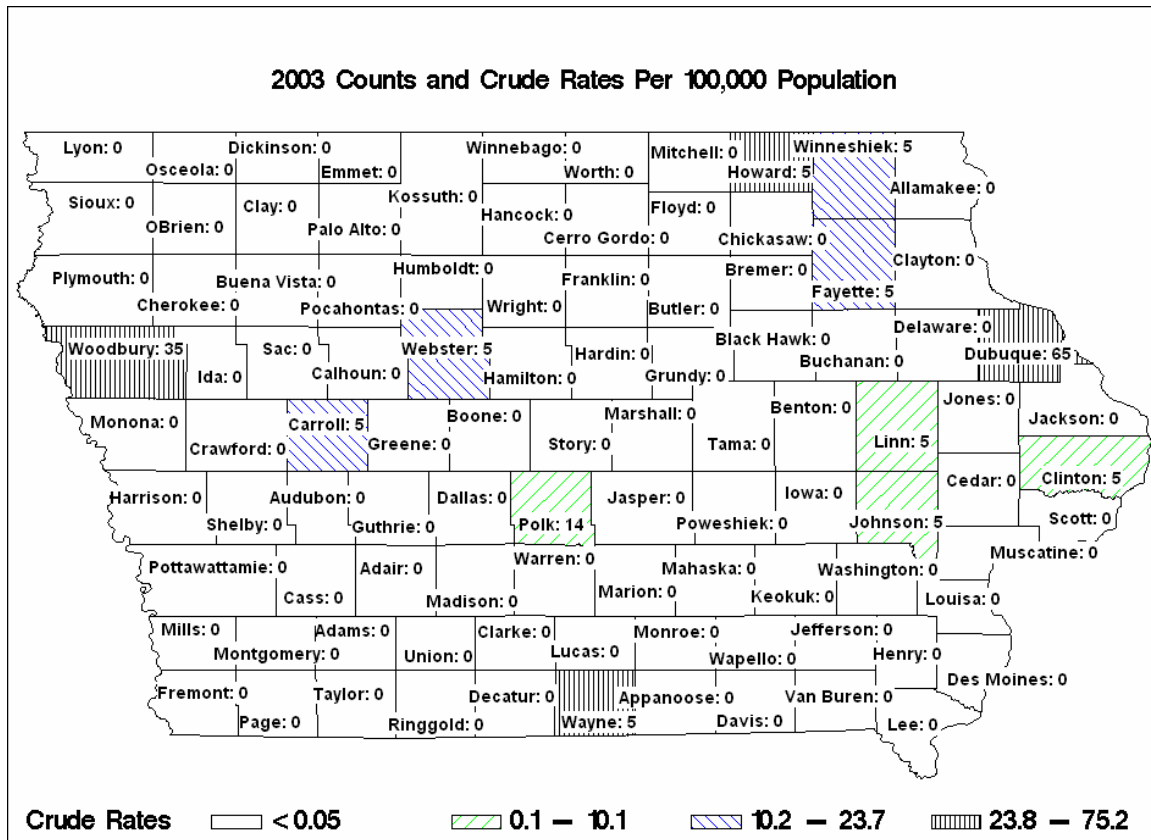

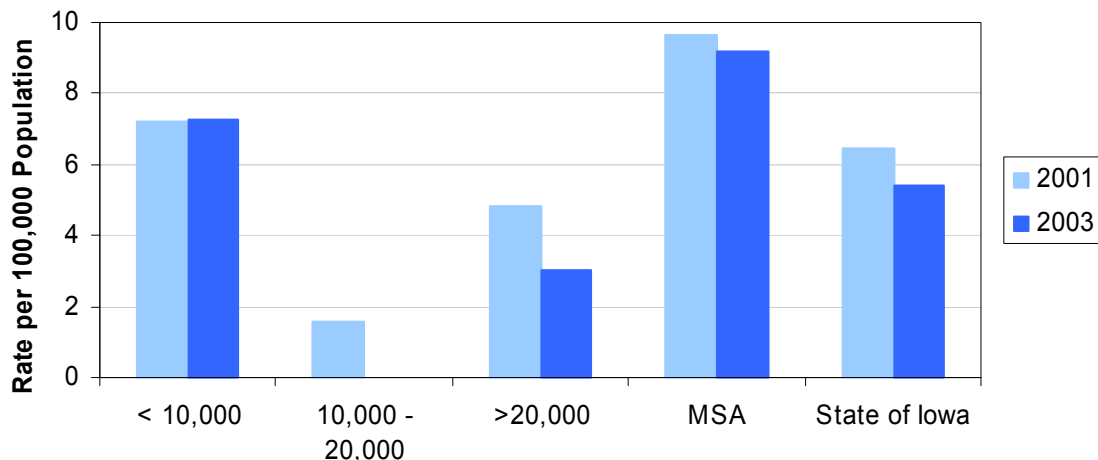

## Beds in 3-5 Bed Units for the Mentally Retarded



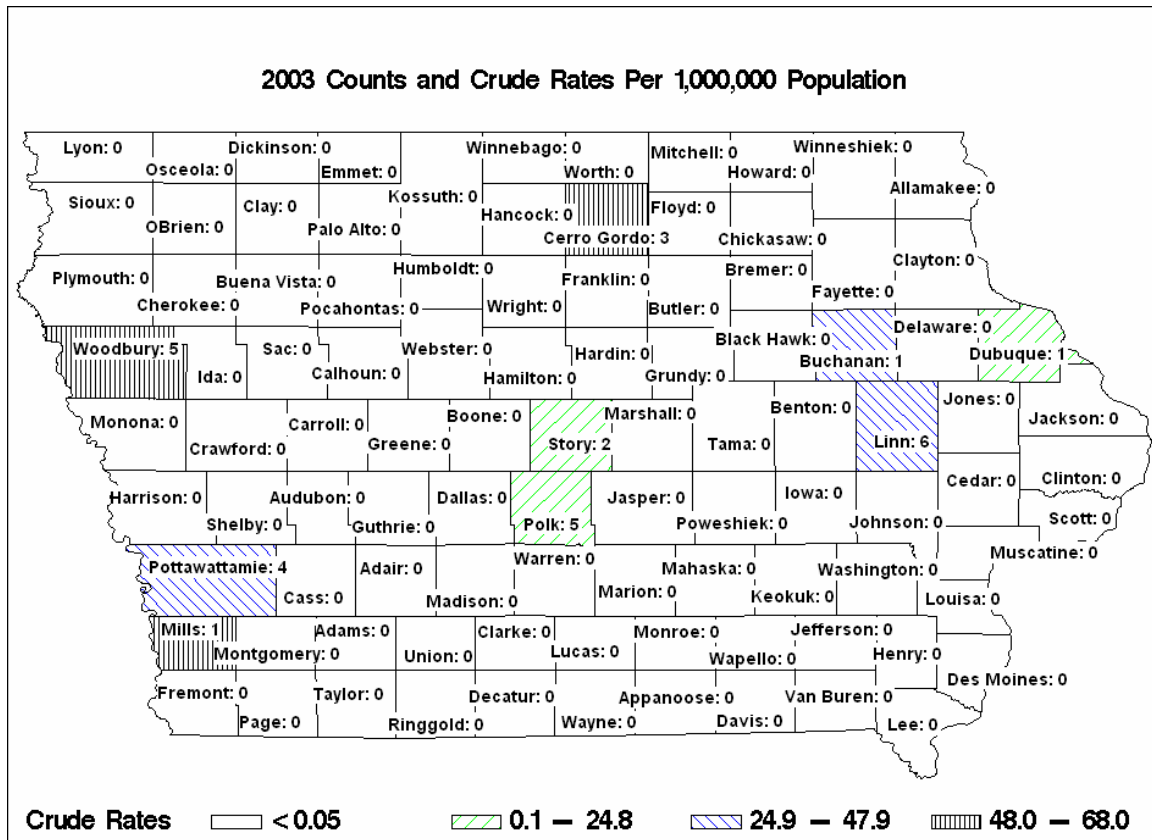

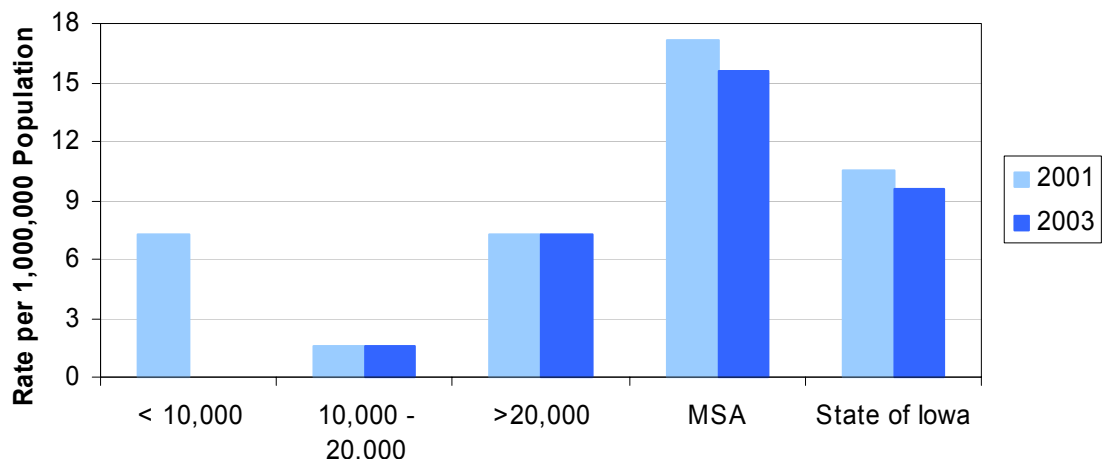

## Psychiatric Medical Institutions for Children



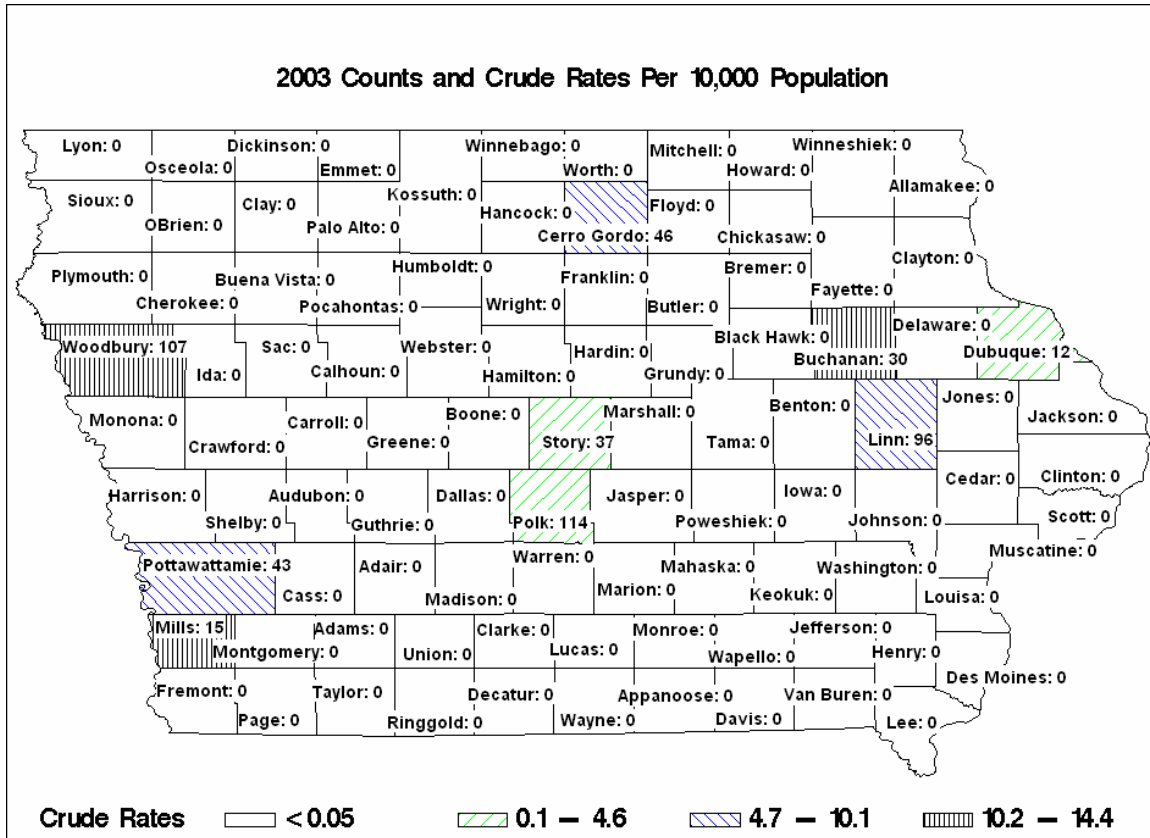

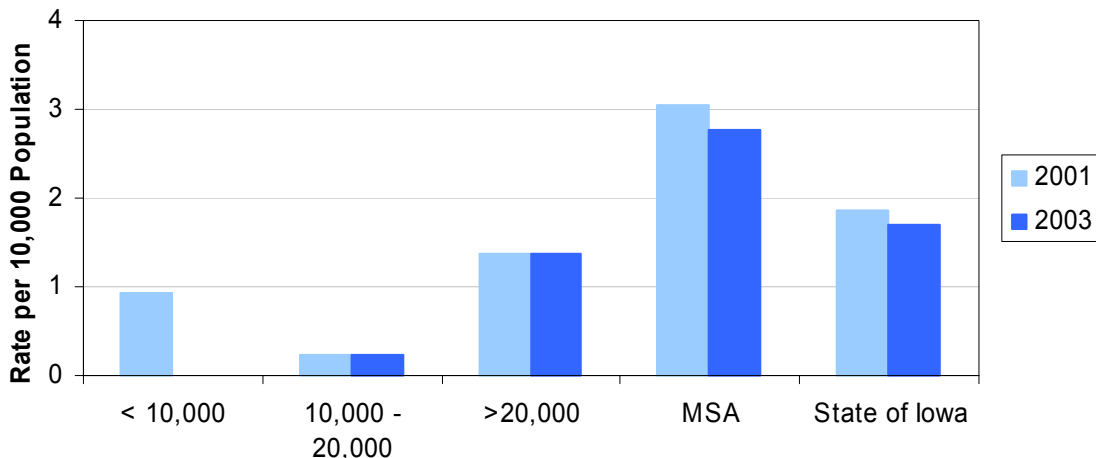

## Beds in Psychiatric Medical Institutions for Children



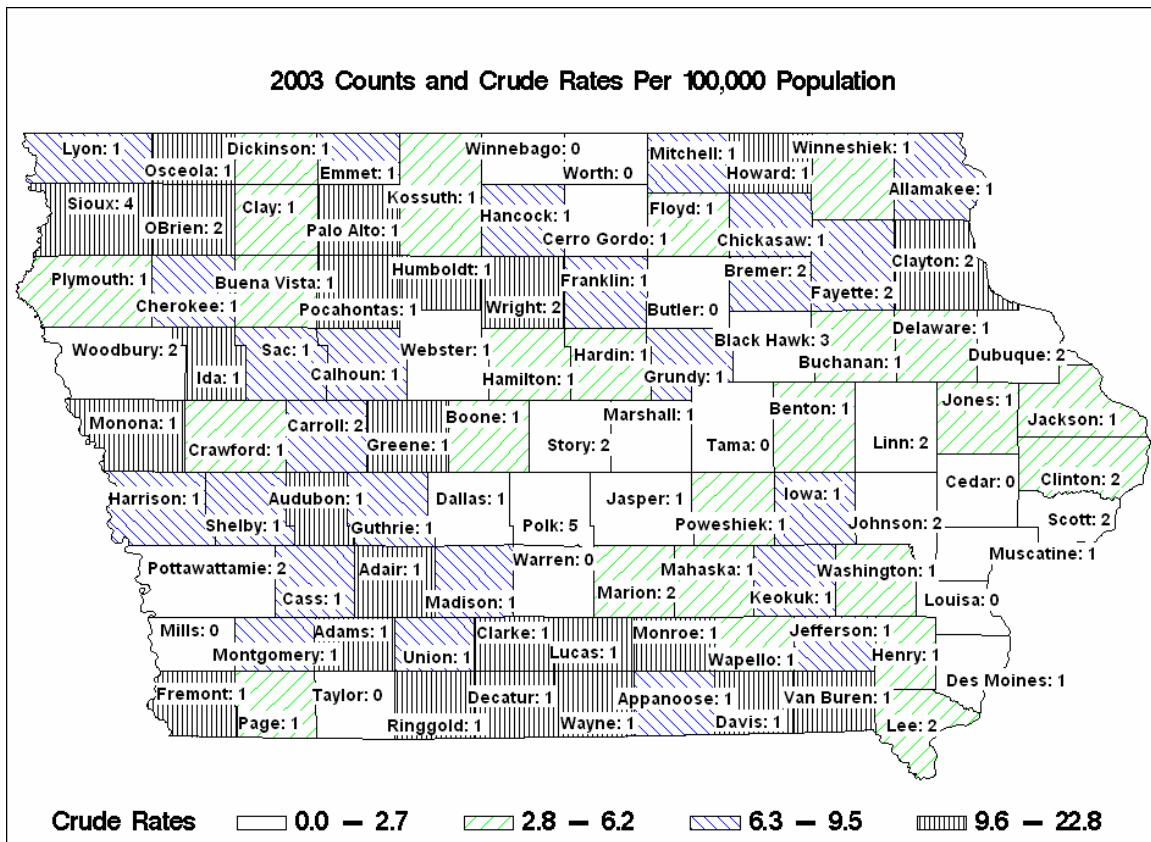

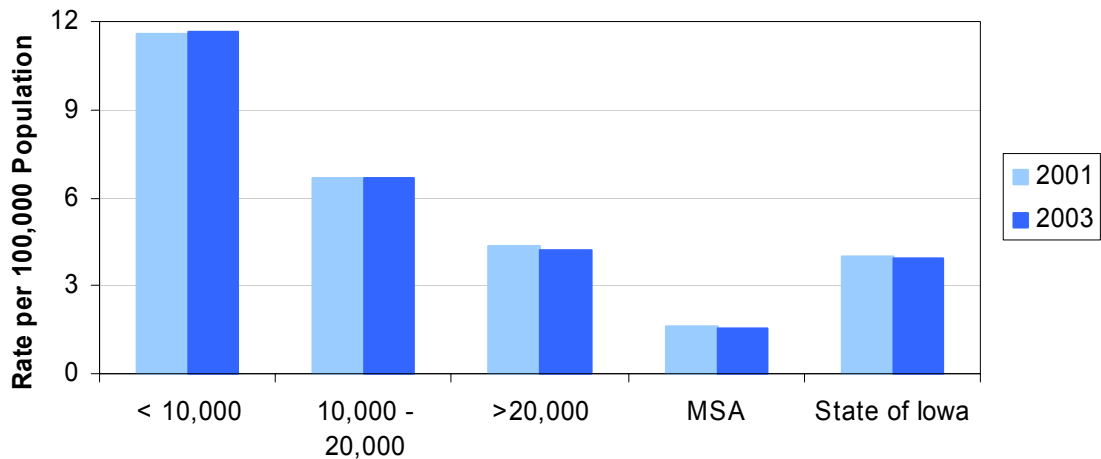

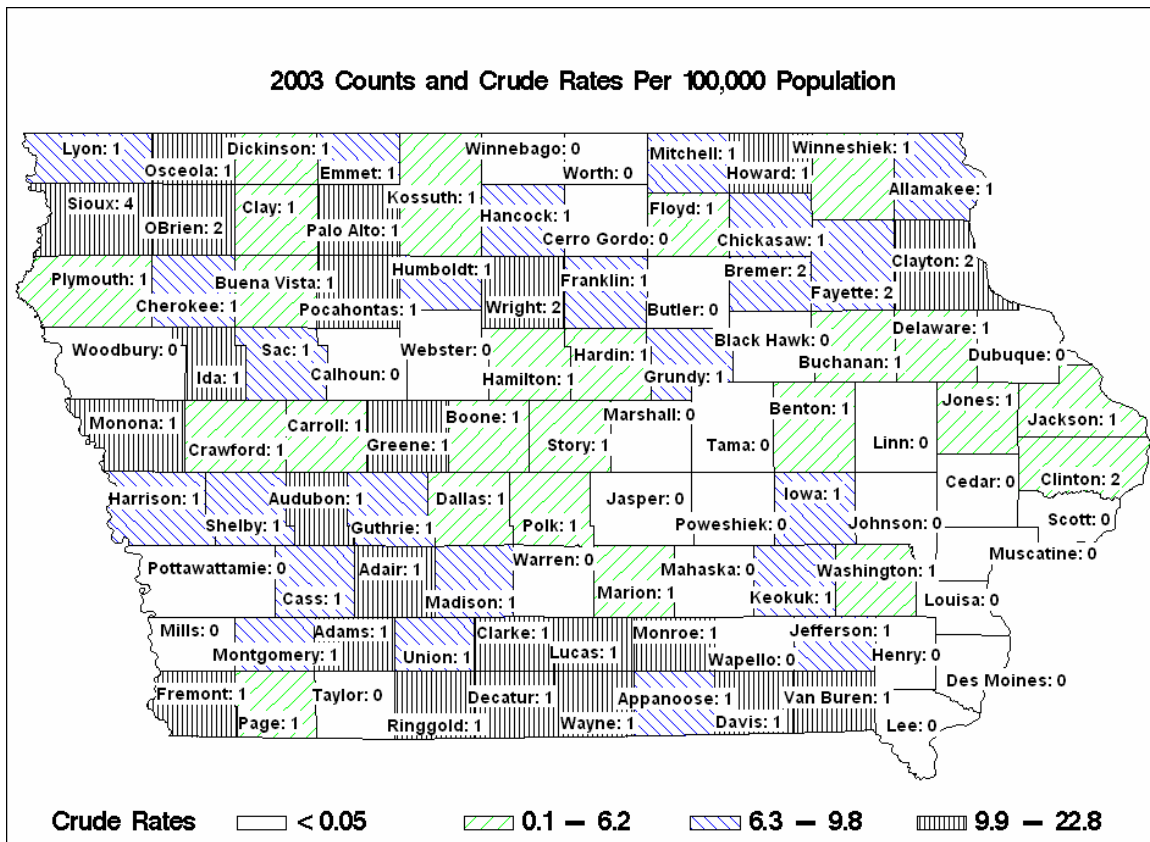

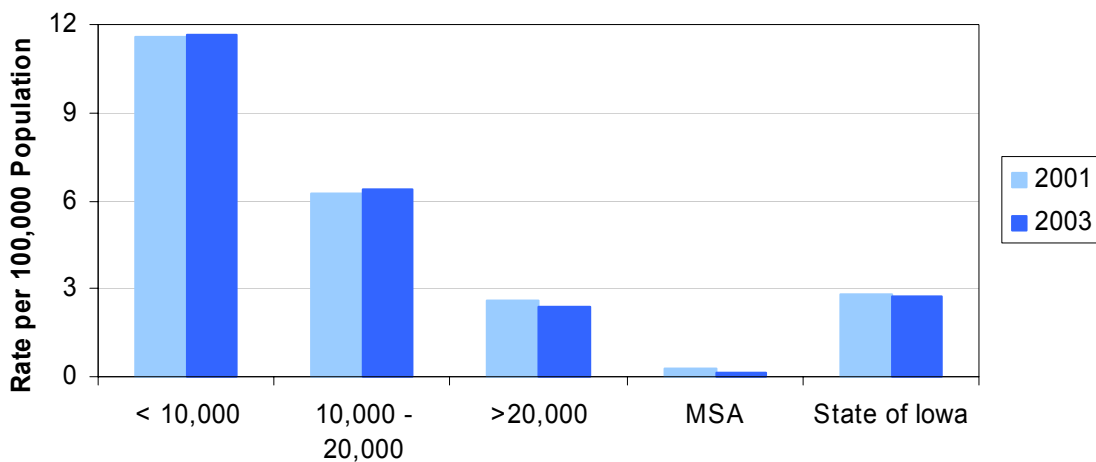

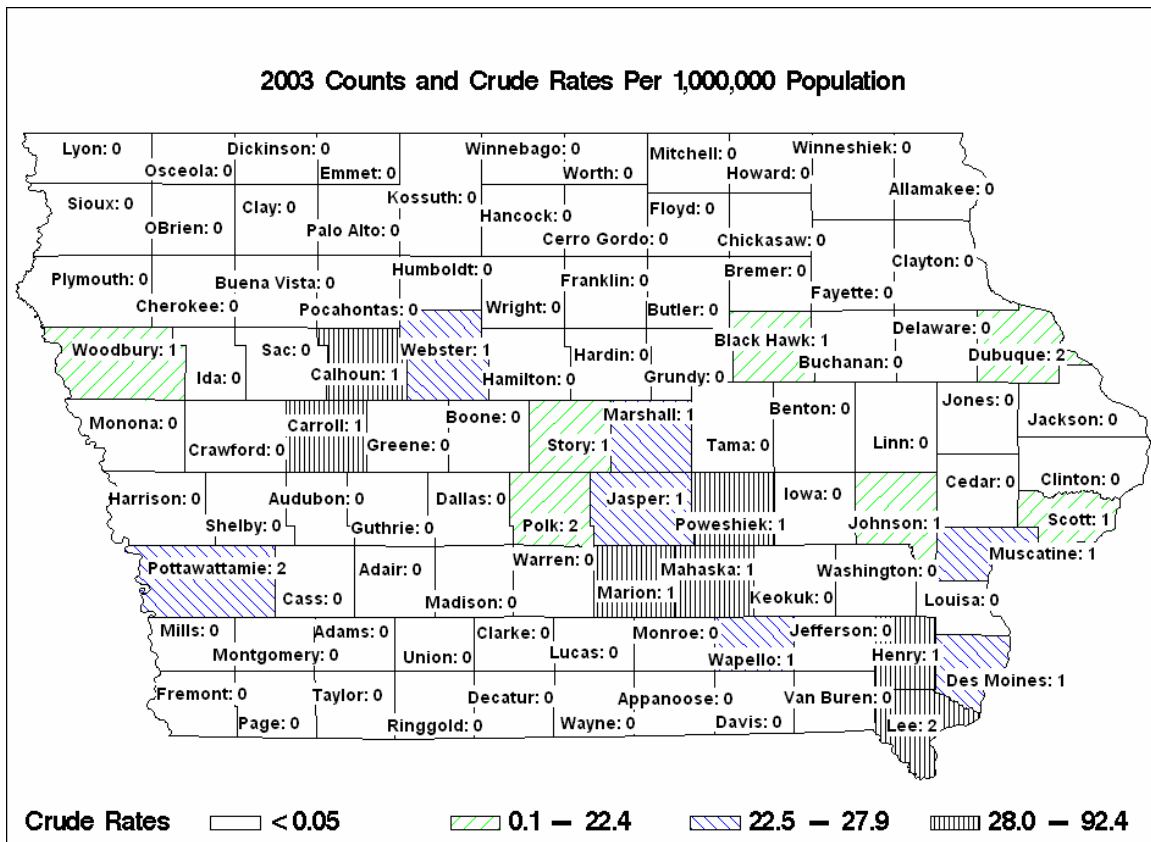

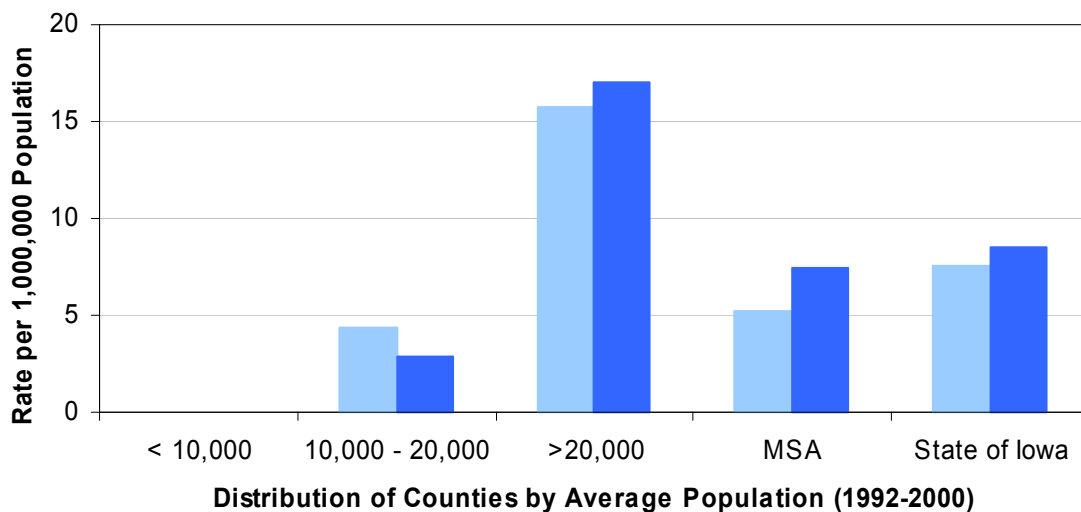

## Area Trauma Care Facilities

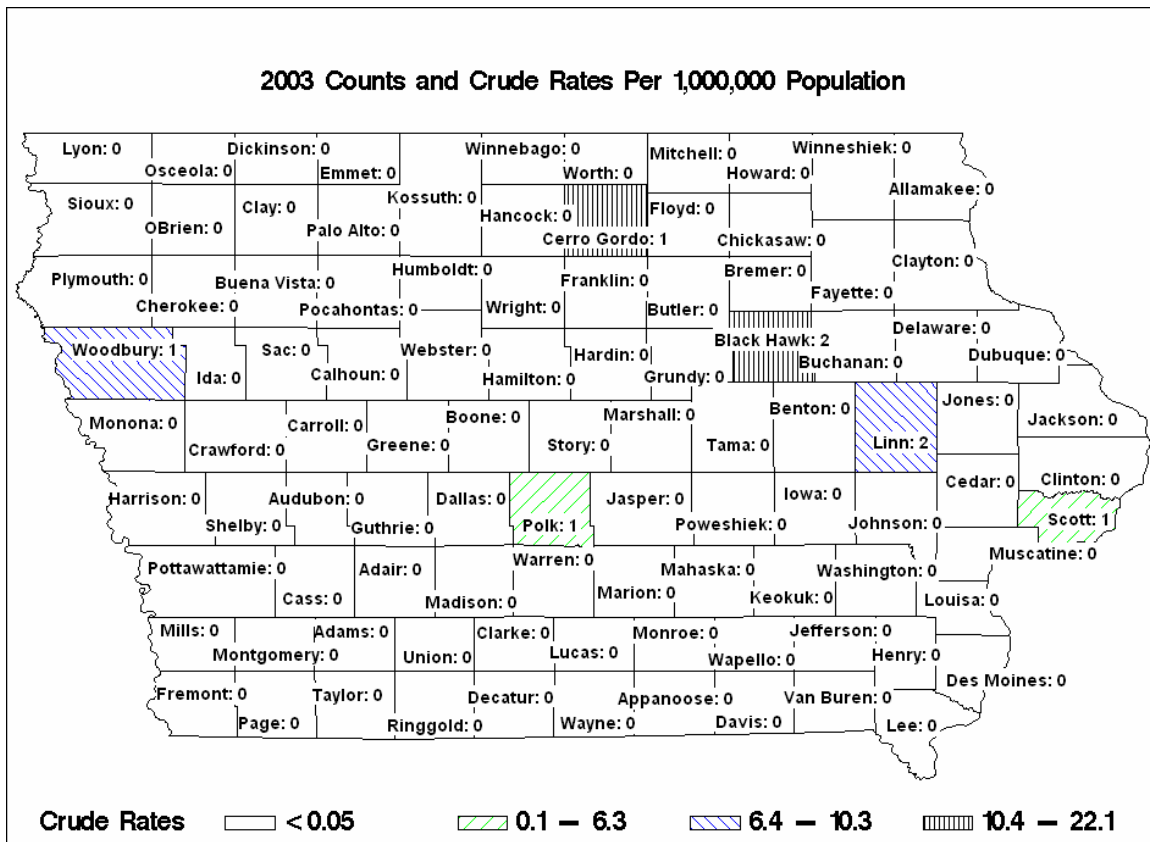

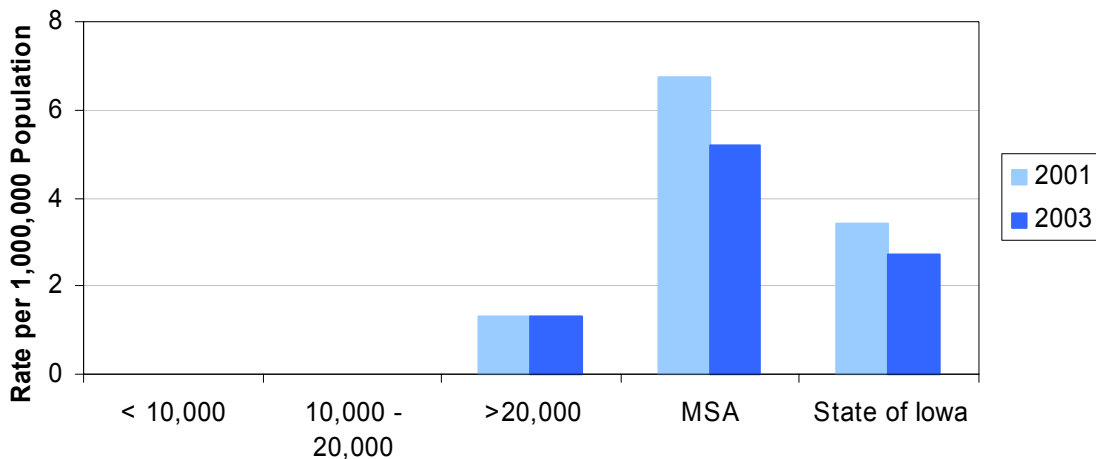

## Regional Trauma Care Facilities



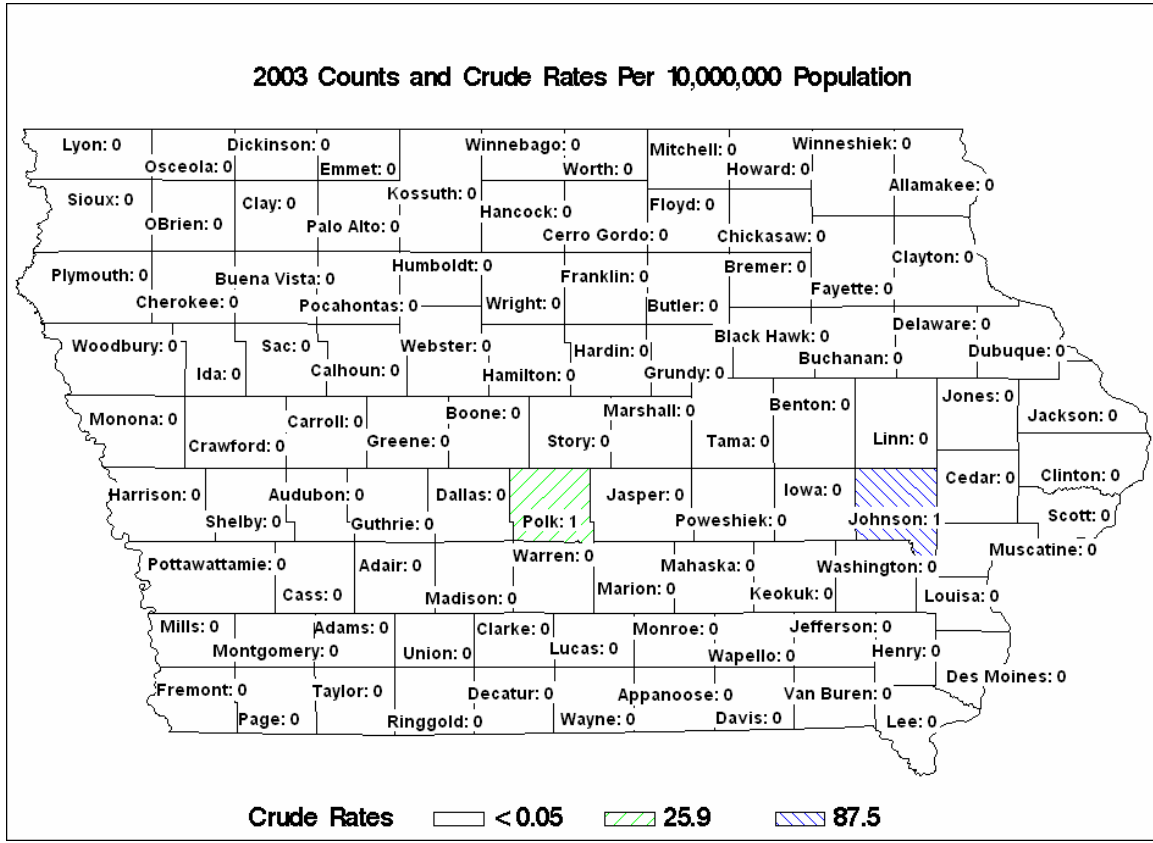

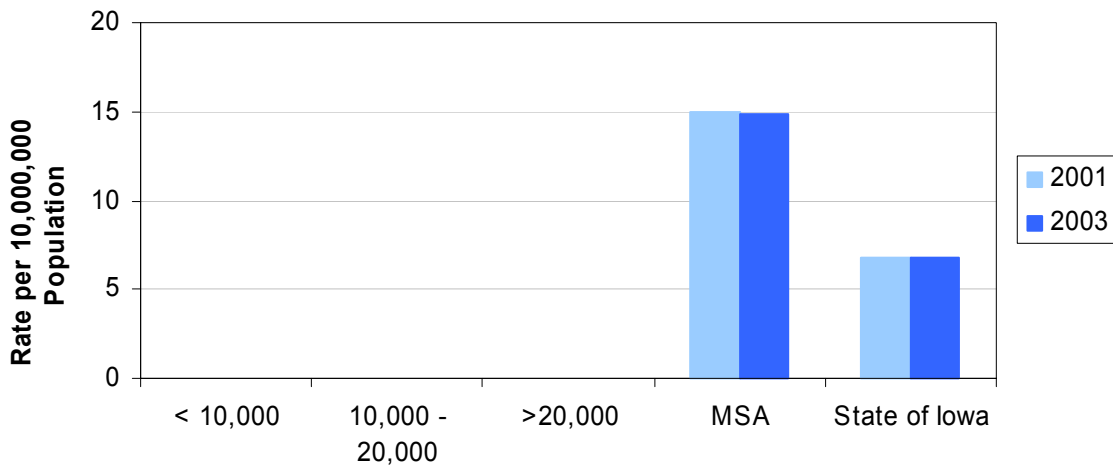
Distribution of Counties by Average Population (1992-2000)
