BOARD OF ADVISORS AWARD FOR FACULTY ACHIEVEMENT IN COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The University of Iowa College of Public Health Board of Advisors is pleased to announce that it is accepting nominations for the **Board of Advisors 201 Award for Faculty Achievement in Community Engagement**. The intent of this award is to acknowledge each year outstanding accomplishments by a faculty member in leadership for community service.¹

The Board of Advisors Award for Faculty Achievement in Community Engagement is presented in grateful appreciation for the College of Public Health faculty's continued commitment to the application of theory, research, and practice to address public health challenges at the community level in Iowa and beyond.

To be eligible for this award, a person must:

- Be a member of the College of Public Health faculty (primary or secondary appointment) during the academic year that the award is granted.
- Have shown sustained commitment to the College of Public Health's mission and goals in community service.
- Have demonstrated exceptional scholarship² in developing and/or advancing the College of Public Health's programs in community service.
- Have gained broad recognition and respect at the state, national and/or international levels for outstanding leadership in community service.

The award recipient will be announced at the CPH Board of Advisors meeting on April 15, 2010.

¹ "Community service" involves efforts by CPH faculty and staff to reach out beyond the University to address the needs of families, groups, and communities in Iowa and the region we serve. Examples of community service include educational programs, technical assistance projects and other consultative services, applied research, policy analysis, and involvement in community-based organizations.

² In its landmark 1990 report, "Scholarship Revisited: Priorities for the Professoriate," the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching defined scholarship as having four separate but overlapping dimensions: the scholarship of discovery, the scholarship of integration, the scholarship of application, and the scholarship of teaching. The Foundation reaffirmed this paradigm in its 1997 report, "Scholarship Assessed: Evaluation of the Professoriate."
