Growing Educational Opportunities in Agricultural **Safety and Health**



1. Graduate Certificate Program in Agricultural Health and Safety

4. Summer Training Program for Medical Students in Rural and Agricultural Health

5. Building Capacity in Agricultural Safety and Health

The Building Capacity Program is funded by NIOSH through the Great Plains Center for Agricultural Health. The goal is to prepare institutions in surrounding states to reproduce and sustain a training program equivalent to the Summer Institute. The future goal is to establish new AgriSafe Clinics in surrounding states, with a long term goal of preparing a cadre of trained providers nationwide for better care and prevention in agricultural communities.
