The principal objective is to establish and triangulate patient, expert physician, and primary care physician estimates of clinically important differences in health related quality of life

over time.

#### **Weekly seminars**

The Center for Health Policy and Research hosted weekly activities during the academic year. These included 6 invited seminars featuring speakers largely from outside the Center, 15 research updates and methods workshops over-viewing recent research approaches and methods by Center associates, and 7 journal club meetings to discuss timely empirical articles involving health policy and services research.

Having seminars and journal club presentations focus on a single theme permitted weekly activities to build on previous sessions.
