Leading Causes of Injury Deaths in the U.S. (2013)




MOTOR VEHICLE CRASHES

Drug overdoses surpassed suicides as the #1 leading cause of injury death in the U.S. in 2013.


Over 2 MILLION Americans misuse prescription drugs

WHAT'S THE SOLUTION?

STRENGTHEN PRESCRIPTION DRUG MONITORING PROGRAMS

PDMPs are state-run electronic databases used to track the prescribing and dispensing of controlled prescription drugs. Use of PDMPs should be mandated, modernized, and fully funded.

EDUCATION FOR PROVIDERS

Ensure responsible prescribing practices. Health care providers should be able to identify signs of addiction so these patients can be referred for treatment.

ACCESS TO TREATMENT

Increase access to substance abuse treatment programs.

EXPANDED TAKE-BACK PROGRAMS AND PATIENT EDUCATION

Ensure people understand the risks of misusing prescription medications, as well as how to safely store and dispose of drugs.
