Semi-Formal Feedback Survey

- Results to be placed in shared CPHGSA board folder
- Pros:
 - Average overall rating for event of 8/10
 - Time of year and day good
 - Overall CPH is a good location
 - o Decorations liked
 - Food choices overall were good
 - Music and game choices were liked (especially Mario Kart)
 - One thought that board games didn't align with a semi-formal
 - It was great to have Cambus drive available
- Cons:
 - One thought that 3 hours was too long, maybe 2 hours is better
 - The setup/presence of large tables prevented interaction between departments
 - Music: sound level could have been more upbeat and some song choices could have been more upbeat
 - o Grilled cheese sandwiches were not good
 - Would have liked liquor and free soda as beverage options
- Other comments/thoughts
 - Increase interdepartmental interactions
 - Fall social event/more casual events (on top of ugly sweater event)
 - Increase advertising for event (earlier and more often)
 - o If location were to change, potentially have it at a taproom

Events/Other

- Blood Drive (May 1)
 - Some comments from students that there was not much advertising about drive; may send an email or put signs up tomorrow to display event for walk-ins
- Thoughts for incoming board
 - Brainstorm ways to increase interaction between departments
 - Have department representative on board be from each student organization
 - May not work as well for OEH or HMP where organizations do not necessarily represent all students
 - Promote social events that make these interactions easier (consistent happy hour, trivia night, speed friending)
 - Think about how to better ensure that events are inclusive of all students/degree programs
 - Create a universal calendar with student orgs to prevent any repetition of professional development events by CPHGSA

- CPHGSA can collaborate with student orgs more to increase attendance of events
- Strengthen CPHGSA's relationship with student org overall
 - Yearly meetings with presidents of each org to layout goals regarding events, networking, etc.
 - Have more professional development events that cater to students who want to go into academia/research, and do the same for public health practitioners

Meeting with Dean Muller (May 3)

- Revisited overcoming lack of interaction between departments
 - We will be hearing back from GPSG soon over inclusion/representation with them; this
 may be away to spark interactions via increased funding and more opportunities for
 events in general
- Alumni mentoring program
 - Aim is to begin process over the summer, have first connections start in October/November
 - o Guidelines for relationships (goals, expectations for communication, etc.) are in place
 - o Mentor may be in role for multiple students
 - Relationship will formally last between November and May, it can continue beyond that if preferred, or student can be connected to another mentor
