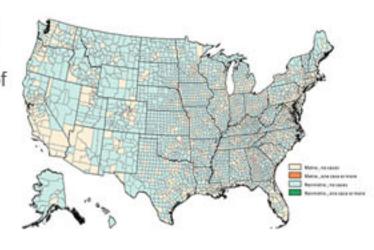

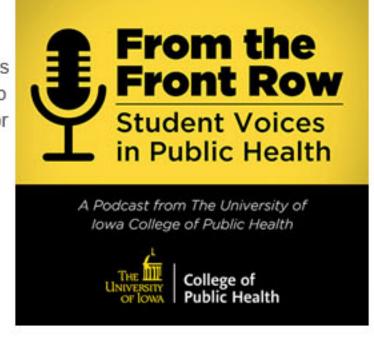
Program helps older folks prepare
